PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or powder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever severely of the Orderson ever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife; without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majelty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majelty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the
Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit

SIR, HAVE the Honor to enclose, for their Lordthips' Information, the Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Le-Geyte, of the Stork, acquainting me, that the Pinnace and Cutter had cut out a Dutch Privateer; also another Letter from Captain Ross, of the Pique, to Vice-Admiral Sir John Thomas Duckworth, stating that he had captured His Catholic Majesty's Corvette Orquijo. His Majesty's Sloop Stork, off Mona, March 25; 1805.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that the Pinnace and Cutter of the Stork, with Eighteen Men, under the Command of Lieutenant Robertson, affifted by Lieutenant Murray, on the Night of the 23d Inflant, out out of the Harbour of Cape Roxo, in Porto Rico, the Dutch Schooner Privateer Antelope, of Five Guns and Fifty-four Men, Forty of which only were on board, and of that Number but Fifteen were made Prisoners, the Rest making their Escape by jumping into the Water.

As the Antelope was prepared to heave down on the following Day, her Guns, &c. were on board a Brig, alongfide of which she was lashed, and from the Circumstance of her Crew being divided between the Two Vessels, and prepared to defend themselves, it became necessary to board them both at once, which was effected in a very gallant Manner, without any other Accident on our Part than that of Lieutenant Murray, and one Seaman being flightly

ducted himself upon the present Occasion with great Steadiness, and I have much Pleasure in acknowledging the Sense I entertain of his Merit, as well as that of Lieutenant Murray, and the Seamen employed.

SIR, HAVE the Honor to inform you of our having, this Afternoon, captured His Catholic Majesty's Corvette Orquijo, of Eighteen Guns and Eightytwo Men, commanded by Don Manuel Degongra, from Carthagena to Havannah, with Dispatches, which were thrown overboard before we took Pol-Lession.

SIR, AVAIL myself of the Opportunity of a Packet failing for England to enclose you a Copy of a Letter which I have this Day transmitted to Rear-Admiral Dacres, Commander in Chief at Jamaica, giving an Account of my having captured His Catholic Majesty's Schooner La Elizabeth, commanded by Don Josef Fer Fexegron, of Ten Guns and Forty-seven Men. Also of a most gallant Exploit performed by Lieutenant Oliver, in storming and taking a Fort, in order to effect the Capture of Three French Privateers, supposed to be laying in the Harbour of Mariel, on the Island of Cuba, and who, from their piratical Depredations, had much annoyed the Trade of His Majesty's Subjects, as well as the Commerce of Neutral Nations; and although the Object of the Expedition was not fully obtained, in consequence of their having failed the Evening previous to the Attack, yet still, I trust, the bold and manly Conduct displayed by Lieutenant Oliver will be honored with the Approbation of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty; and although Lieutenant Campbell had not the good Fortune to share in the Glory of this well intended Enterprise, yet great Credit is due to his Intentions and Exertions. Lieutenant Oliver speaks in the highest Terms of Commendation of the Spirit and Alacrity of the Honorable Almeira De Courcy, as well as the Whole of his intrepid Crew.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that, on the 3d Instant, His Majesty's Ship under my Direction captured, off the Havannah, His Catholic Ma-jefty's Schooner La Elizabeth, of Ten Guns and an active and valuable Officer, appears to have con- | Forty-leven Men, commanded by Don Josef Fer Fexeyron. She was charged with Dispatches from the Governor of Pensacola, which were thrown

overboard previous to her furrendering.

Having received Information that there were Three French Privateers in the Harbour of Mariel, (a small convenient Port, a little to the Westward of the Havannah,) which had annoyed most considerably the Trade of His Majesty's Subjects, transfently passing through the Gulph, I determined, if possible, to rout this Band of Pirates; for, from Vessel, to rout this Band of Pirates; for, from their plundering and ill treating the Crew of every Vessel they met with, most particularly the Americans, they were nothing better; and Lieutenants Oliver and Campbell having, in the most handsome Manner, volunteered their Service on this hazardous Occasion, I dispatched these excellent Officers, accompanied by the Honorable Almericas De Courcy, Midshipman, on the Evening of the 5th Instant, in Two Boats; and as it was absolutely necessary to gain Possession of a Round Tower near Forty Feet high, on the Top of which were planted Three long Twenty-four-Pounders, with loop Holes round its Circumference for Musketry, and manned with a Captain and Thirty Soldiers, I gave Directions to attack and carry the Fort previous to their entering the Harbour, so as to enable them to secure a safe Retreat. Lieutenant Oliver, the senior Officer, being in the headmost Boat, finding himself discovered, and as not a Moment was to be lost at such a critical Period, most nobly advanced, without waiting for his Friend, landed in the Face, and in Oppolition to a most tremendous Fire, without condescending to peturn the Salutation, mounted the Fort by a Ladder which he had previously provided, and fairly carried it by a Coup de Main with Thirteen Men, leaving Mr. De Courcy, with Three others, to guard the Boat, with an Accident to only One brave Man (George Allison) wounded, who was unfortunately shot through the Body before the Boat touched the Ground, but I am happy to say, from the Care and Attention of Mr. Williams, the Surgeon, he is already rapidly recovering; the Enemy had Two killed and Three wounded.

Lieutenant Oliver, leaving Serjeant Denslow, of the Marines, (who, from his Bravery and good Conduct, deferves great Praise,) with Six Men to guard the Fort, and having been rejoined by Lieutenant Campbell, dashed on to attack the Privateers, but to their great Mortification found they had failed the Day previous on a Cruise; he was therefore obliged to be contented with taking Possession of Two Schooners, laden with Sugar, which he most gallantly brought away from alongside a Wharf, in spite of repeated Discharges of Musketry from the Troops and Militia which poured down in Numbers, from the

furrounding Country.

I should not have been thus particular in recounting a Circumstance which was not attended with ultimate Success, were it not to mark my Admiration of the noble Conduct of Lieutenant Oliver in so gallantly attacking and carrying a Fort which, with the Men it contained, ought to have maintained its Position against Fifty Times the Number that were opposed; but nothing could withstand the prompt and manly Steps taken by that Officer and his gallant Crew on this Occasion; and as, in my humble Judgment, the Attempt was most daring and hazardous, and had the Privateers been there, I doubt

humbly folicit the Honor of Notice to this most gallant Officer.

My LORD, Yopaze, May 1, ... HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command has just captured the Spanish Ship Privateer Napoleon, of St. Sebastian, pierced for Twenty Guns, and mounting Ten Nine-Pounders and Four Eighteen-Pound Carronades, with One Hundred and Eight Men on
