AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 30th His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary 1805,

PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or powder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever severes the Master General of the Ordernoe. ever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife; without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majelty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majelty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the
Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit
the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majelly to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Manunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and
