. Stant, a strange Sáil was seen on the Larboard Bow; 1 Distance Seven or Eight Miles, having then light Airs, and inclinable to calm, and perceiving the Stranger was using every Effort with his Sweeps to escape, and apparently full of Men, and no Hopes of my closing with His Majesty's Ship, I directed Henry Smith Wilson, First Lieutenant, with Four Boats, affilted by James Tait and Henry Bourchier, Second and Third Lieutenants, backed by the Volunteer Services of Thomas Tud, or Tucker, a Paffenger belonging to His Majelly's Ship Northumberland, Walter Powell, Lieutenant of Marines, and Chaples Burdle, Professor Mainley Ship and Charles Rundle, Purfer of 'His Majelty's Ship under my Command, to proceed with the Boats, and endeavour to come up with the Chace. cool and determined Manner in which this Service was performed, after a Pull of many Hours, and the strong Opposition they met with, from the welldirected Fire of the Guns and Musketry, kept up by the Privateer, induces me thus publicly to express my Approbation of every Officer, Seaman, and Marine engaged on this Service; and I am happy to add, that no Lives were lost upon the Occasion.

This Privateer was from Samana, on a Cruile, out Ten Days, without taking any Thing.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Nots of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Pradices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artifi-cers or Manusacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign *Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminter, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS | at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ize-

for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any inch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm.; fuch Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forseit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavour-ing to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His' Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid, fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforesaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. 'IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cutton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench
