PRESENT,

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for continuing several Laws relating to the regalating the Prices at which Corn and Grain may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and to the " Admission to Entry of Oil and Blubber of New-" foundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects car "Foundand, taken by Fais Majetty's Studjects car rying on the Fishery from and residing in the said "Island, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March" One thousand eight-hundred and six, and for re viving, amending, and continuing for the same Term, an Act of the last Session of Parliament other Articles in foreign Ships:" It is enacted. that an Act made in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act" for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One. thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign ships, on Pay-" ment of the like Duties, as if imported in British ". or Irish Ships," should be, and the same is revived and continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six: And it is further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, and in Ire-land, for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors, and the Privy Council of Ireland, by Order in Council, from Time to Time, to permit until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, any Goat Skins, dressed or undressed, to be imported in any foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry in any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of fuch, and the like Duties of Customs and Excise, as are due and payable on Goat Skins when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Goat Skins when so imported shall be subject to all Rules, . Regulations, and Conditions, and to all Penalties and

Forfeitures for the Breach thereof to which they would have been liable and subject if they had been imported into Great Britain or Ireland according to any Law or Laws in force at the Time of passing the faid Act: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the above recited Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until further Order, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed. Calve Skins, or Pieces of Calve Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wood (except Cotton Wool), and Goat Skins, dressed or undressed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and the Articles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Fortyfecond Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act to alter and amend an Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating, the Port of London, so far as the same relates to the Concerns of the West India Dock Company thereby established; and for extending to other Objects the Compensaamongst other Things, enacted as follows, and be it further enacted, That when any One or more of the faid Docks, by the faid recited Act, and this Act, authorised to be made and built by the said Directors, with the Bason or Basons, Quays, Wharfe, Warehouses, and other Works belonging, or to belong, thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the Time being, the same shall be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods

respectively, it shall be lawful for the said Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the Time being, and he and they are hereby respectively authorised and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known the same; which Certificate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London, and the said Certifi-cate, to published as aforesaid, shall be deemed sufficient Notice to all Parties interested of the Completion of the Dock or Docks, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works, concerning which faid Certificate of Approbation shall be made; and from and after the Expiration of Ten Days next ensuing the first Publication of the said Certificate in Manner aforefaid, all the Rates and Duties by the faid recited Act, and this Act, made payable to the faid West India Dock Company for Ships and Vesfels entering into and using any of the faid Docks, or any of the Basons and Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto; and also for any Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes which shall be landed or discharged from any Ship or Vessel lying within any of the faid Docks, or any of the Basons or Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto, shall commence, take effect, and become payable; and then and from thenceforth, such of the Quays and Wharfs then made or built by the said Company, as shall be described in such Certificate to be fit for the Reception of Goods, shall be deemed and taken to be legal Quays and Wharfs accordingly; and all the Provisions in the faid recited Act as contained, relating to the Increase of Interest or Dividends from and after the Completion of the faid Docks, Cuts, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works, and for compelling Ships and Vessels that shall arrive in the River Thames, with West India Produce on board, to unload and land the Whole of such Produce within some or one of the said Docks, or on the Quays or Wharfs belonging, or which shall belong thereto, and for causing the King's Duties, in respect of the same, to be ascertained at such Quays or Wharfs, and not elfewhere; and compelling Tuch Ships or Vessels belonging to or frequenting the Port of London, as shall be used or employed in the West India Trade, to ship or take in their respective Cargoes, and be loaded either in some or one of the said Docks, or in such Part of the River Thames as shall be below the Entrance into the intended Canal at ·Blackwall aforefaid, shall take Effect, and be in full Force and Operation; and the faid Term of Twentyone Years, during which the aforefaid Provisions are to be in Force, shall commence at and be computed from the Expiration of Ten Days from the Time of the first Publication of the said Certificate as beforementioned; any Thing in the faid recited Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of the Right Honorable Henry Addington, Nathaniel Bond, and John Hiley Addington, Three of the Lords: Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the Twenty-first Day of August, One thousand eight-hundred and two, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, the said Lords Commissioners did certify and make known that the following Works, made and erected by the faid West India r

Dock Company under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, (viz.) The Entrance Bason at the East End of the said Works, the Great Dock, Three Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock, numbered 2, 4, and 8, and the Quays or Wharfs from the North Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the said Dock, along the North Side of the same Deck, and terminating at the North Side of the Lock at the West Entrance of the faid Dock:

And whereas by another Gertificate under the

Hands of the Right Honorable Henry Addington, Charles Small Pybus, and George Thynne, Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, granted on the Twenty-second Day of August, One thousand eight hundred and three, in pursuance of the faid Act paffed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said last-mentioned Lords Commissioners did certify and make known that the following Works, made and erected by the faid West India Dock Company under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, were fo far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were sit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, (viz.) The Entrance Bason at the West End of the faid Works; also Ten additional Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock, that is to say, Three large Warehouses, numbered 3, 6, and 7; Three other large Warehouses, (viz.) One Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 2, and called No. 1; the Second Warehouse covering the Space between the Warehouse No. 4, and No. 6, and called No. 5: and the Third Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 8, and called No. 9; also Four other smaller Warehouses, the first covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 2, and No. 3; the Second covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 3, and No. 4; the Third covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 6 and No 7; and the Fourth covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 7 and No. 8; and which said Ten Warehouses, together with the Three Warehouses comprised in the said former Certificate, formed the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof, and likewise One other

Warehouse at the East End of the said Dock: We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, surther certify and make known, that the following Works, made and erected by the faid West India Dock Company under Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, are so far completed, that, in our Judgment, the fame are fit for the Reception of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, (viz.) Two Warehouses on the South Side of the said Dock, and the Quays or Wharfs on the South Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the faid Dock, along the South Side of the same Dock, and terminating at the South Side of the Lock, at the West Entrance of the faid Dock.

HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-VV third Year of the Reign of His present Ma-jesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouse without Payment of Duty," it is famongst other Things) enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same, under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchan-Bize of the Duties of Cultoms or Excile due on the Importation thereof, ful ject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by this Act: Provided always, that no such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged or secured, unless and until such Warehouses and other Works belonging to, or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Preafurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may respectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act, and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners . of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorised and enjoined, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses, which Certificate shall be published Three Times at least, in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning

Newspapers then usually circulated in London:"

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and four, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the faid A& of Parliament, certify and make known, that the following Warehouses belonging to the West India Dock Company, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and deferibed in the faid Table annexed to the faid Act of Parliament, marked (A), and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act, viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses adjoining each other, and situate on the North Side of the large Dock, belonging to the West India Dock Company, at the Isle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the faid feveral Warehouses accordingly:

And whereas by the Ninth Section of the said !

Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows: That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Com-missioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the faid Tables respectively, at the Time of passing this Act:
