The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HIS Majefty, in Council, was this Day pleafed to declare the Right Honorable John Jeffereys Earl Camden, Lord Prefident of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council, and his Lordship took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint the Right Honorable Robert Stewart, commonly called Lord Viscount Caftlereagh, to be One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, he was, this Day, by His Majesty's Command, fworn one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

His Majefty having been graciously pleased to deliver the Cuftody of the Seals of the Dutchy and County-Palatine of Lancaster to the Right Honor able Dudley Lord Harrowby, the Oath of Chancellor of the faid Dutchy was, this Day, by His Majefty's Command, administered to his Lordship.

/ HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Nineteenth Day of December laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majetty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, I foundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settle-

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 10th | hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled " An Act to enable His Majefty " to reftrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and " more effectually to prevent the Exportation of " Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro-" hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheles His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Gerrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to New-
