BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY's TREASURY. hekeas by an Act, paffed in the Fortyfecond Year of His prefent Majelly's Reign,
intituled An Act to alter and amend an Act, paffed in the Thirty-nirth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled An Act for rendering.more commodious, and for better regulating, the Port of Lon. don, fo far as the fame relates to the Concerns of the Weft Incia Dock Company thereby eftablifhed; and for extending to other Objects the Compenfations directed to be made by the faid Act; it is, amongt other Things, enacted as follows, and be it further ena\&ted, That when any One or more of the faid Docks, by the faid recited Act, and this ACt, authorifed to be made and built by the faid Directors, with the Bafon or Balons, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoufes, and other Works belonging, or to belong, thereto, fhall be fo far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treafurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, for the Time being, the fame thall be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods rcfpectively, it thall be lawful for the faid Lord High Treafurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commiflioners of His Majefty's Treafury, for the Time being, and he and they are hereby refpectively authorifed and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known the fame; which Certificate fhall be publifhed Three Times at the leaft in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newfpapers thea ufually circulated in London, and the faid Certificate, to publifhed as aforefaid, fhall be deemed fuf. ficient Notice to all Parties interefted of the Completion of the Dock or Docks, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoufes, and other Works, concerning which faid Certificate of Approbation fhall be made; and from and after the Expiration of Ten Days next enfuing the firt Publication of the faid Certificate in Manner aforefaid, all the Rates and Duties by the faid recited Aet, and this Act, made payable to the faid Weft India Dock Company for Ships and Veffels entering into and ufing any of the laid Docks, or any of the Bafons and Cuts belonging, or which Chall belong thereto ; and alfo for any Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes which fhall be landed or dif. charged from any Ship or Veffel lying within any of the faid Docks, or any of the Bafons or Cuts belonging, or which fhall belong thereto, fhall commence, take effect, and become payable; and then and from thenceforth, fuch of the Quays and Wharfs then made or built by the faid Company, as flall be defcribed in fuch Certificate to be fit for the Reception of Goods, fhall be deemed and taken to be legal Quays and Wharfs accordingly ; and all the Provifions in the faid recited AEt as contained, relating to the Increafe of Intereft or Dividends from and after the Completion of the faid Docks, Cuts, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoufes, and other Works, and for compelling Ships and Veffels that fhall arrive in the River Thames, with Wef India Produce on board, to unload and land the Whole of fuch Produce within fome or one of the faid Docks, or on the Quays or Wharfs belonging, or which hall belong thereto, and for caufing the King's Duties, in refpect of the fame, to be afcertained at fuch Quays or Wharfs, and not elfewhere ; and compelling luch Ships or Veffels belonging to or frequenting the Port of London, as fhall be uled or employed in the Weft India'Trade, to thip or take in their refpective Cargoes, and be loaded cither in fome or one of the faid Docks, or in fuch Part of the River Thames as fhall
