'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Timelimited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Nineteenth Day of December last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be constinued for some Time languar. His Majesty doth tinued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obwithout Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forseitures insticted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty's " to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and "to rettrain the Exportation of Evaval Scioles, and
"more effectually to prevent the Exportation of
"Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro"hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:"
But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that
mothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Orduance, or by the Com-

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 20th missioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent of June 1805, any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neces-fary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantaions in America or the Weil Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury. the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, installed "An Act 41 for continuing several Laws relating to the re-" gulating the Prices at which Corn and Grain " may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, " and from Ireland to Great Britain; and to the Admission to Entry of Oil and Blubber of New-foundland, taken by His Majesty's Subjects carrying on the Fishery from and residing in the said Island, until the Twenty-lifth Day of March 46 One thousand eight hundred and fix, and for re viving, amending, and continuing for the same Term, an Act of the last Session of Parliament for permitting the Importation of Hides and ther Articles in foreign Ships. It is enacted, that an Act made in the Forty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hide Calf Stine Hand Tall of Hides, Calf-Skins Horns, Tallow, and Wool " (except Cetton Wool), in Foreign ohips, on Payment of the like Duties, as if imported in British or Irish Ships," should be, and the same is revived and continued until the Twenty-fish Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six: And it is further enacted, I hat it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, and in Ireland, for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors, and the Privy Council of Ireland, by Order in Council, from Time to time, to permit until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, any Goat Skins, dreffed or undressed, to be imported in any foreign Ship or Vessel, and to be admitted to Entry an any Port or Place in the United Kingdom, on Payment of such, and the like Duties of Customs and Excise, as are due and payable on Goat Skins when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel, any Thing contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and all such Goat Skins when so imported shall be subject to all Rules, Regulations, and Conditions, and to all Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof to which they would have been liable and subject if they had been imported into Great Britain or Ireland according to any Law or Laws in force at the Time of passing the faid Act: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majetty by the above recited Act passed in the present Sel fion of Parliament, to allow, and doth hereby allow, until further Order, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undreffed. Calve Skins, or Pieces of Calve Skins, dreffed or undreffed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), and Goat Skins, dreffed or undreffed, in any Foreign Ship or Vessel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excise as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any Bri-
