I am, &c. JAMES R. DACRES. SIR, Surveillante, May 3, 1805. **I** BEG Leave to inform you, that His Majefly's Ship under my Command has this Day, in Lat. 20 Deg. 37 Min. N. Long. 82 Deg. 36 Min. W. captured the Spanifh Schooner Privateer El Refulgo, mounting Three Guns, and having on board Fifty-three Men. She has been out Fifteen Days, and taken nothing.

On my Return to this Station, I had the good Fortune to fall in with, and capture the Spa-nifh Felucca Privateer San Felix El Socoro, had Forty Men on board, and One Six-Pounder thrown overboard in Chace, out from St. Jago Eleven Days, and had taken but one Droger.

She had many Pal-fengers on board, who affilted in making fome Refistance, but they could not withstand the gallant Attack of the Barge. The Passengers elcaped in a finall Boat. The Conception is from Santa Maxta Martha, laden with Logwood; a new Schooner, and fails very faft: the Priloners (Nine in Number) appear fickly, and I shall land them immediately to prevent the Introduction of Difease into the Seine, which I truft will meet your Approbation.

Enclosed I transmit a Letter from Captain Matson, which will inform their Lordships of the Particulars of the Capture.

I beg Leave to mention that Captain Mation, defcribes this Brig as failing extraordinarily wells that the Venus took her by having her to Leeward and out-carrying her, and that by the Wind fhe fails much faster than the Venus.
