which was Summoned to begin at Westminster the Seventeenth day of October, 1679, and by fe-

veral Prorogations continued to the One and twentieth day of October last, was lately Prorogued until Thursday the Twentieth day of this instant January, The Kings most Excellent Majesty being resolved to Meet fils People, and to bave their Advice in frequent Parliaments, bath thought fit to Diffolve this prefent Parliament, And doth by this His Royal Proclamation Diffolve the fame accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of this present Parliament are bereby Discharged from their Meeting on the said Twen-Fieth of this Instant January.

And His Majesty is Graciously pleased to make known to all His Loving Subjects, that He hath given dire-Hions to the Lord Chancellor of England, for the issuing ing out of Writs in due Form of Law, for the Calling of a New. Parliament, which fhall Begin and be Holden at Oxford, on the One and twentieth day of March next, 1630.

Given at our Court at Whitehal, the Eighteenth day of *fanuary*, in the Two and thirtieth year of our Reign.

Genoua, Jan 8. Not any Ships have arrived here this week; and only three French Veffels have ' Sailed from hence, one for Lubone laden with Paper, Rice and fine goods, and the other two for the Rivera to lade Oyl. Some diforders have lately happened on the borders of Montferrat between the Subjects of the Duke of Manua, and of this State, and we are told that fome thoulands of the Country people are, in Arms; the first news of it was brought hither the fifth Inftant at midnight, and the Senate the next morning ordered 360 Horfe to march thither; and farther ordered 100 Horfe to march to Novi; We have not yet any account of what has been done, but it's not doubted but things will be foon quieted.

Lintz, Fan. 4. A great many Commissions are preparing for the making of new Levies, though it's fa'd they will not be given out till the latter end of this Month- The Emparors journey to Ratubonne is spoken of at Court, as a thing not very unlikely, though at the fame time we are affured that the Emperor will haften to Vienna, to be fo much nearer Hungary, a General Dyet of which Kingdom is to meet in March as they tell us, in cafe the Affairs of that Kingdom are in fuch a poflure, as that there may be ground to hope that that affembly will be able to finish that great work that is in band for the reftoring a laffing Peace and tranquility to that Kingdom.

Lintz, fan. 6. Two days fince arrived here the Marquis of Seppeville, Envoye Extraordinary from the French King: he has not yet had his Audience, nor feen any of the Ministers. We cannot yet tell you what progress is made in the Affairs of the Hungarians; all that we know is, That the Bishop of Sebestini, makes it his whole busine's ; that he is frequently with the Emperor, and with the Chief Minifters, and that every body fays, that there is a good prospect of things being brought to a happy ilfue- There is a report, that the Emperor will go this Spring to Ratisbonne; and that feveral Princes of the Empire will likewife repair thither, and that fome very important Refolutions will be there taken.

Berlin, Fan. 9. Our Elector has put out a Placaets whereby he forbids the railing of any men for the fervice of any Prince or State, whatfoever , whithin his Toricoffes, and that und r very levere, . penaltics, the realon of which his Electoral Highness declares to be that he intends to encrease the number of his Forces, and therefore would have his Subjects preferved for his own fervice. It is faid for certain that our Elector and the Elector of Saxony are to have a meeting at fome place on the frontiers, but that the time is not yet fixed ; and the occasion of this Enterview we are told, is the prefeat State of the Empire, and the defigns that feem to be on foot to diffurb its Peace. Here is arrived an Envoye from Moscovy, who goes from hence to Vienna and other Courts, to defire the Mediation of thele Princes for the compoling the differences that are depending between the Czar and the King of Poland.

Strasburg, Fan. 10. On Monday last arrived here the Baron de Monclar with a great many French Officers, who having been treated with great kindncls and respect, parted again on Wednesday for the upper Alface, Monsieur de Monelar intending to go and haften the Fortifications that are miking at Lautersheim. The Bayliffs and other Officers that have been cited to appear before the Chamber at Brifae are most of them gone thithet with their Registers and Records, and the reft will follow.

Cologne, Fan. 14 The Letters we receive from Bohemia, tell us, that that Kingdom, as likewife Hangaty and Moravia, continue to be very much afflicted with the Plague; and that the Magistrates of Vienna fearing the infection may be brought thither again from those Countries, fome of them had proposed that no person should be permitted entrance into their City, who came from Bohemia, Hungary, or Moravia, although they are fu nifhed with Letters of Health.
