THE King has been pleased to grant unto Philip Duncombe Pauncefort, of Great Brickhall, in the County of Buckingham, Esq; his Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may take and use the Surname of Duncombe in Addition to, and after the Surname of Pauncefort, and also bear the Arms of Duncombe, quarterly with those of Pauncefort, Duncombe in the first Quarter, out of grateful and affectionate Respect to the Memory of his Godfather the Reverend Philip Barton, late of Great Brickhall aforesaid, deceased; and in compliance with an Injunction contained in the last Will and Testament of the said Philip Barton; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
