The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. T is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council,

That the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty second Day of this inftant August, be further prorogued to Thursday the Seventeenth Day of October next.

PROCLAMATION,

For pardoning fuch Seamen, and Marines as have deferted, and fball return into His Majefty's Service on or before the Tenth Day of Oflober next.

WHEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have deferted from any of Our Ships fince the Sixteenth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and -three, and shall be willing to return to Our Service ; 'We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Deferters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the Tenth Day of October next; and We do hereby further promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Seamen as, having deferted, are now belonging to fome one of Our Ships; and We do also hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deferted from Our Service fince the faid Sixteenth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred .and three, and shall, on or before the faid Tenth Day of October next, furrender themselves at the Head-Quarters of the Royal Marines ellablished at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces; and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Royal Marines, fo furrendering themselves as aforefaid, shall be released

T the Court at Weymouth, the 15th Day of j and discharged from all Profecutions, Imprisonments, and Penalties, commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offences, but that such Pardon shall not entitle Deserters, whether Seamen or Marines, to any Arrears of Pay forfeited by fuch Defertion; and We do hereby further declare, that all fuch Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, who Ihall not, on or before the faid Tenth Day of October next, furrender themselves on board One of Our Ships or Veffels of War, or at the Head-Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to fome Recruiting Party of the faid Forces, or who shall hereafter abfent themfelves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and, being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall fuffer the Punishment of Death, or fuch other Punishment as they shall be condemned to fuffer by Sentence of the faid Court.
