PROCLAMATION,

For pardoning fuch Seamen and Marines as have de-ferted, and fhall return into His Majefly's Service on or before the Tenth Day of October next.

GEORGE R.

A/HEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have deferted from any of Our Ships fince the Sixteenth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and three, and shall be willing to return to Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council. to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deferters as shall repair on board any of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the Tenth Day of October next: and We do hereby further promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Sea-men as, having deferted, are now belonging to fome one of Our Ships; and We do alfo hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deferted from Our Service fince the faid Sixteenth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and three, and shall, on or before the faid Tenth Day of October next, furrender themfelves at the Head-Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces: and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Royal Marines, fo furrendering themselves as aforetaid, shall be released and difcharged from all Profecutions, Imprifonments, and Penalties, commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offences, but that such Pardon shall not entitle Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, to any Arrears of Pay forfeited by fuch De-fertion; and We do hereby further declare, that all fuch Deferters, whether Seamen or Marines, who shall not, ou or before the faid Tenth Day of October next, furrender themfelves on board One of Our Ships or Veffels of War, or at the Head Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to some Recruiting

Martial, and, being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to fuffer by Sentence of the faid Court.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS by an A& passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An A& " for making further Provision for the effectual "Performance of Quarantine;" it is, amongil other Things enacted, That whereas certain Sorts of Goods and Merchandize are more especially liable to retain Infection, and may be brought from Places infected into other Countries, and from thence im-ported into Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, all fuch Goods and Merchandize as shall be particularly specified for that Purpose in any Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs, and Succeffors in Council, concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection as aforefaid, which shall be brought or imported into any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforesaid, from any foreign Country or Place, in any Ship or Veffel whatever, and the Ships or Vessels in which the fame shall be brought, and alfo all Ships and Vessels which shall arrive from any Port or Place whatever, under any alarming or sufficients Circumstances as to Infection, shall be subject and liable to such Regulations and Restrictions as shall be made by such Order or Orders of His Majefty, his Heirs, or Succeffors in Council as aforcfaid, refpecting the fame: And whereas Rags are an Article more cipecially liable to retain In-Party of the faid Forces, or who shall hereafter ab-fection; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of fection; His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Islands

fhall be imported shall be fubject to Quarantine or not, fuch Rags shall in all Cafes (except as here-after excepted and provided) be subject to the Performance of special Quarantine, and shall be unpacked, opened, and aired on board the Lazaret in Standgate Creek, or on board Lighters, or other proper Vessels at the Out-Ports, (as the Cafe may be,) for the Space of Forty Days before the fame are difcharged; provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that in cafe fuch Rags shall have been imported in any Ship or Vessel coming from the Ports of Hambro' or Bremen, or from any of the Ports to the Northward thereof; and in cafe a special Declaration, authenticated upon Oath, and certified in the Mode directed by Sec. 42, of His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of April last, respecting the Quarantine of Goods enu-merated in the First Class of the said Order, and brought from any Port or Place in Europe without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Establishment for the Performance of Quarantine, declared fufficient by His Majesty in Council for that Purpose, shall have been produced to the Superintendant of Quarantine at Standgate Creek, or to the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Out-Ports of this Kingdom, (as the Cafe may be,) shewing that such Rags are brought from the Port where the same have been Ihipped, and are the Produce of, or collected from fuch Port, or the Interior of the Country, and have undergone the Process there usual of having been stacked; and if fuch Rags shall, as shon as they can be come at, be taken out of the Ship importing the fame, and be put on board Lighters, (in cafe the faid Ship is bound to the Port of London,) to be fent to Standgate Creek, or (if bound to any of the Out-Ports,) to be fent to the Quarantine Station appointed for fuch Ports relpectively, to be there unpacked, opened, and aired for the Space of Fif-teen Days; and if the fame shall be cleaned Rags, then, after having been fo unpacked, opened, and aired as aforefaid, for the Space of Fifteen Days, fuch Rags shall be discharged :-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Trealury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance. His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid liles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
