From Alicant we have advice that a Vest I was arrived there with the baggage of the Marquis d' Offera from Sardinia; That the Marquis and his Lady, who were on Board another Vessel came from thence at the same time; that in bad weather they were seperated, and that fince the Marquis has not been heard of, which makes it very much feared, he is call away.

Vienna, Jan. 10. We cannot yet learn what progress the Bishop of Sebestini and the Hungarian Deputies have made in their Negoriations at Lintz. We know they have had many confe ences with the Chief Ministers, and that there appears a good disposition on both files to accommo ate marters, but whether that work be to be finished at Lintz, or is to be left to the Dyet, which they say the Emperor has promifed shall me t at Newstadt, is fomewhat doubtful, though the general discourse if we may believe it, says the latter. In order thereunto the Emperor they say will be here in March, and that from hence he will go to Newstadt , to be present at the said Dyet: but the Em ress and her Court will not remove from Lintz till the Danubs be open, that so they may come down | We have feveral reports here concernby Water ing the Turks, as well with relation to the Preparations they are making against the Poles and the Moscovites, as the endeavors they are said to be using to withdraw the Hungarians from their duty to the Emperor, but they deserve not any credit.

Francfort, Fan. 19. Leavies are making in many places of the Empire as well for the Service of the Emperor as the French King, though fome Princes

will permit neither within th ir Territories. From Lintz they write, that the Affairs of Hungary do now chiefly employ the Ministers of the Court, and the Emperor at the desire of Count Teckeley and some other Principal nien among the Hungarians, who are diposed to a Peace, had appointed a General meeting of the States of Hungary, to be held in March next at Newsladt, and that it was the common saying at Court that the Emperor intended to be there in person.

Berlin, Fan. 14. Here has happened a very fad a cident by Pire, which begun in the House of the Heer Somnits. Son to the Heer Somnits that was our Electors Ambassador at Nimsguen, in so dead a time of the night, that it was not discovered in a long time, and when it was, the Fire had got to such a head, that it was not possible to save his Wife, 3 Children and 4 or 5 Servants who were all burnt, he himself escaping with great hazard; his House and three more were destroyed by the Fire, which was at last overcome, the presence of the Electoral Letters from Spain give us no great prospect of an accommodation of the diff rences between the Crown and our Elector, so that that Affair continues in the same State it was. We are affured that the Elector of Saxony will be at this Court . about the beginning of the next Month.

Betlin, Fan. 19. Last night arrived here an Ambassa lor from Moscovy in his way to Paris, Monsieur Rabenae the French Minister at this Court went to meet him, and brought him into the Town; He will stay here two or three days and then continue his journey by the way of Hamburg. Hamburg, Fan. 21. The Letters we receive from Berlin give us an account, that the three Months fet by the Elector of Brandenburg as the terme in which he would expect the refolutions of the Crown of Spain, concerning the giving him fat sfaction in his pretentions about the Arrears of Subfidies, being expired, without any appearance of an accommodation, his Electoral Highness has resolved to proceed to the disposal of the Ship taken by his Friga's in the Road of Oftend, and of the goods that w re laden in her which have hitherto re-mained untouched. The Dyet is met in Poland, and we are told that the King will endeavor to get the Succ ssion of the Crown secured to his Eldest Son, but that he is like to meet with much opp. fition. It is likewise said that the King of Poland dors not approve of the Marriage between Prince Louis the Elector of Brandenburgs Second Son and the Princess Radzeville, and that it will be brought before the Dyer.
