Lord Chamberlain's Office, September 24, 1805. RDERS for the Court's Change of Mourning,

on Sunday next, the 29th Inftant, for His late Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, His Majefty's Brother, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk, fringed or plain Linen, White Gloves, Necklaces, and Earrings, Black or White Shoes, Fans, and Tippets.

Undrefs.-White or Grey Lutestrings, Tabbies, or Damaiks.

The Gentlemen to wear Black, full trimmed, fringed, or plain Linen, Black Swords and Buckles.

.Undrefs-Grey Frocks.

The Court to change the Mourning further on Sunday the 6th of October next, viz.

The Ladies to wear Black Silk, or Velvet-coloured Ribbons, Fans, and Tippets; or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuffs, with Black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear Black Coats, and Black or plain White, or White and Gold, or White and Silver Stuff Waistcoats, full-trimmed, coloured 2 Swords and Buckles.

And on Sunday, the 13th Day of October next, the Court to go out of Mourning.

His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint Her Royal Highnels the Princels of Wales to be the Keeper of His Palace or Manfion-Houfe at Greenwich, in the County of Kent, commonly called the King's House or the Queen's House, within His Manor of East Greenwich, in the faid County, with the Garden next adjoining thereto, and the Old Tilt Yard there, and also of His Perk, called Greenwich Park, to the faid Palace or Houfe adjoining, with the Lodges and other Buildings fituate therein.

Whitehall, September 27, 1805.

The King has been pleafed to grant unto George Burrell Hadgley, late of Abridge, in the County of Effex, but now of Northweald Baffett, in the faid County, Gentleman, (Sou of Robert Hadgley, of Abridge aforefaid, by Sarah his Wife, Daughter of George Burrell, of Northweald Baffett aforefaid, and Silter of John Burrell, late of the fame Place, Gentleman, deceased,) His Royal Licence and Au-thority, that he and his Islue, may take and use the Surname of Burrell only, in compliance with an Injugation contained in the laft Will and Teltament

of his faid maternal Uncle the faid John Burrell : And alfo to order, that this His Majetty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
