CALCUTTA GAZETTE EXTRAORDINARY. Fort William, April 23, 1805.

The following Heads of Intelligence, compiled from offi-cial and authentic Documents, received by His Excel lency the Most Noble the Governor-General, from His Excellency the Right Honorable the Commander in Chief, are published for general Information.

MAJOR-GENERAL SMITH, with a Detachment of Cavalry under his Command, having effected the Expulsion of Meer Khan from Rohilcund and the Doab, rejoined the Army of the Right Honorable the Commander in Chief before Bhurtpore, on the 23d March. Meer Khan having re-crossed the Jumna, had arrived at Futtypore Seckree Two Days before General Smith's Arrival at Bhurtpore. This Chieftain had been abandoned by his Troops, with the Exception of a small Body of Cavalry. The whole of his Infantry and Artillery quitted his Service about the Period of his Incursion into the Doab, and have since been employed by other Chieftains. Meer Khan himself is gone off in Search of Employment, attended only by a few Hundred preda-

tory Horse.
On the 29th of March, His Excellency the Right Honorable the Commander in Chief, with a Column Honorable the Commander in Chief, with a Column of Cavalry under his Lordship's personal Command, and a Column of Infantry under Lieutenant Colonel Don, marched at Two o'Clock in the Morning to surprise the Cavalry of Jeswuth Rao Holkar, which was encamped at the Distance of a sew Cols from Bhurtpore. were directed against Two of his principal Encamp-His Lordship, with the Cavalry, took a circuitous Direction to the Right under the Hills; whilft Lieutenant-Colonel Don, with the Infantry, proceeded to the Left, by the direct Road to the Position of the Enemy. The Enemy having received Information from his Hircarrahs, of the Approach of the British Troops, was prepared for Flight when Lord Lake reached his Camp. The Enemy however suffered some Loss in his Retreat from the Fire of the Column of Infantry; and, not-withflanding the Rapidity of his Flight, a Charge was effected by the British Cavalry, in which about Two Hundred of the Enemy were destroyed. A Quantity of Baggage and Cattle, confisting chiefly of about Fifty Camels, One Hundred Horles, Two Elephants, and Twenty Hackeries, was captured by the British Troops. Lord Lake, after pursuing the Enemy to a confiderable Distance, returned to Camp at Eleven o'Clock in the same Morning.

On the 1st of April, Lord Lake received Intelligence that Jeswunt Rao Holkar, having retired to a greater Diltance from the British Army, had assembled the greater Part of his Troops and Baggage at a Position Eight Coss from Bhurtpore, in the Direction of Futtypore, Lord Lake, in the Expectation that the Vigilance of the Enemy would be dimi-nished in confequence of the Distance to which he had removed, determined to attempt to surprise his Camp. His Lordship accordingly marched at One o'Clock on the Morning of the 2d of April, with the whole of the Cavalry, the Horse Artillery, and the Reserve of the Army, and arrived in the Neighboushood of Jeswunt Rao Holkar's Camp before the Dawn of Day; Jeswunt Rao Holkar had received Intelligence of Lord Lake's Approach about Two Hours before his Lordship had reached the V:cinity of his Camp, and had fent off a Part of his Baggage. The Enemy was posted round a high Village, with his Front covered by cultivated Fields, surrounded by high Enclosures. It was still Dark, but the Fires of the Enemy enabled Lord Lake to make his Disposition for the Attack without wait-

The Cavalry, formed in Two Lines, moved round to the Right, whilft the Referve and the Horse Artillery, under Lieutenant-Colonel Don, was ordered to gain the Left of the Village with as much Expeedition as possible. The Cavalry advanced at a Trot; and, when arrived within a short Distance of the Enemy, the Right Squadrons of each Regiment in the first Line were ordered to charge, supported by the remaining Squadrons, and by the second Line. The Enemy, on seeing the Advance of the British Troops, made every possible Exertion to escape, but was charged with Success in various Directions, and suffered great Loss. The British Cavalry continued the Pursuit to a very considerable Distance, and did not design until the Enemy was entirely dispersed. The Enemy is said to have lost upwards of One Thousand Men on this Occasion.

Upon the Return of Lord Lake to Camp, a Body of Infantry, with Colours, was observed moving in the Direction of the Jungle which surrounds the Town of Bhurtpore. This Body of Infantry was immediately charged by a Squadron of His Majesty's 8th Dragoons, under Colonel Vandeleur. Upon the Approach of the Squadron, and after a few of the Enemy had been cut down, the Remainder threw down their Arms, and were made Prifoners. The Colours of this Corps were captured, and it proved to be a Body of Meer Khan's Infantry, which, having quitted that Chief, was proceeding to offer its Services to Runjeet Sing.

Lord Lake returned to Camp at One o'Clock P. M. after a March, including the Pursuit of the

Enemy, of apwards of Fifty Miles.

A Detachment, composed of the 1st Battalion of the 25th Native Regiment, Six Companies of the 24th Native Regiment, One Battalion of Irregular Infantry, and the Agra Irregular Horse, the whole commanded by Captain Royle, marched from Agra on the 26th of March, to dislodge Hernaut, the Chelah of Jeswunt Rao Holkar, who, with the Remains of Holkar's Infantry and Guns, and a Body of Holkar's Cavalry under Bapoojee, had occupied a Position between Bharee and Dholpore. Captain Royle's Detachment, after a March of Twelve Cols, came up with the Cavalry of the Enemy under Bapoojee on the 31st of March, and succeeded in completely deseating this Corps. On the 6th of April, Captain Royle received Information that the principal Body of the Enemy, of which he was in Pursuit, had taken up a strong Position under the Walls of the fortissed Town of Adawlut Nuggur. This Body of the Enemy consisted of between Three and Four Thousand Men, Cavalry and Infantry, and Three Guns. Captain Royle arrived at Adawlut Nuggur at Eight o'Clock on the Morning of the 7th of April, and found the Enemy advantageously posted, having the Fort of Adawlut Nuggur in his Rear, and his Front and Flanks.covered by deep Ravines, occupied by Troops.

Captain Royle, with great Spirit and Judgment, immediately formed his Detachment for the Attack, and, advancing under a very heavy and well-directed Fire from the Enemy's Artillery, and from his Troops stationed in the Ravines, compelled the Enemy to abandon his Guns, and to retreat with the Loss of all his Artillery and Baggage. The Agra Horse, under Colonel Pohlman, pursued the Fugitives to the Distance of Five Coss from Adawlut Nuggur, and killed great Numbers of them. On this Occasion were also captured upwards of Twenty Stands of Colours, and a great Number of Muskets, of European Manufacture, Matchlocks, Spikes, &c. &c. The Conduct of the Troops in.

this Action was highly exemplary, and especially that of the newly raised Battalions of the 24th and 25th Regiments of Native Infantry, which had not been embodied for more than a Period of Five Months.

His Excellency the Right Honorable the Commander in Chief having completed his Arrangements for the Recommencement of Operations against the Town of Bhurtpore, changed the Ground of his Encampment before Bhurtpore on the 9th of April, and took up his final Position for the Attack. The reduced Condition of Jeswunt Rao Holkar's Power, and the manifest Inability of continuing to afford Support to the declining Fortune of that Chieftain, added to the Preparations for the Attack of Bhurtpore, had previously induced Rajah Runjeet Sing to sue for Peace on the 25th of February, and to offer Terms, which, after some Negociation, were, with certain Modifications, accepted by Lord Lake, under the Authority of the Covernor-General. An Agreement was accordingly formed on the 10th April, by which Runjeet Sing has ceded to the Honorable Company the Fortress of Deeg, and has resorted all the Districts which were conferred upon him by the British Government after the Conclusion of Peace with Dowlut Rao Scindiah. Runjeet Sing has also engaged to pay the Sum of Twenty Lacs of Rupees to the Company; of this Three Lacs of Rupees are to be paid immediately, and the Remainder by Instalments, at stated Periods. The Son of Runjeet Sing was delivered up to Lord Lake on the 11th April, as an Hostage for the due Performance of these Engage-

Lieutenant-Colonel Holmes, of the Bombay Establishment, with a valuable Convoy of Provisions and Stores from Guzerat, and Treasure to a large Amount, for the Use of the Bombay Army under Major-General Jones, marched into Camp before Bhurtpore, on the 10th April. Colonel Holmes had marched from Guzerat to Bhurtpore, without having met any material Interruption; and since he passed Kotah, he had not seen any Enemy.

It appears by the most authentic Accounts, that Juswunt Rao Holkar is reduced to the greatest Distress, and that his Force is nearly destroyed. The Troops which remain in his Service, are not more than sufficient to form a Guard for the Protection of his Person, and even these are entirely dispirited, and harassed by the several Deseats they have recently experienced, and by the continual state of Alarm in which they have been kept by the persevering Activity and Vigilance of the Commander in Chief.

The Dominions of the Company in Hindostan are in a State of Tranquillity, and the Bands of Robbers which had disturbed certain Districts of the North Western Provinces, have been expelled.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Forces.

War Office, Odober 8, 1805. HEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are, at this Time, feveral Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces who might be induced to return to

their Duty by an Offer of His Ma-Marlborough. jesty's gracious Pardon, and that such an Instance of His Royal Clemency Winchester. Hereford. would have a due Influence upon Shrewfbury. their future Behaviour; His Majesty Birmingham. has been graciously pleased to grant Manchester. . His Free Pardon to all Deserters Nottingham. from His Regular Land Forces who shall surrender themselves, on or before the Eighth Day of De-Leeds. York. Kendal. cember next, to any of His Majesty's Durham. Civil Magistrates, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, to any Edinburgh. Glafgow. of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin Aberdeen. Invernefs. Bedford. hereof, or to the Inspector-General of Ipfavich. the Recruiting Service in the Isle of Maidstone. Wight.

Such Deserters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to command, and, when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

Every Deferter not actually ferving in any of His Majesty's Regiments is to surrender himself for General Service.

Deferters ferving in other Corps, (Militia, and Army of Referve excepted,) are to continue therein upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers, who are to report the Circum-flance to the Secretary at War and the Adjutant-General, and they shall not be liable at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved: but this Clause is not to extend to Deferters enlifted by the Corps for raising Recruits for general Service, which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon, on declaring themselves to be such, and will be transferred to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to com-

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorifed and required to certify the Day on which such Deserter surrendered himself, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deserter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer com-

manding at fuch Military Poll.

No Soldier who may defert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who surrendered himself upon any former Proclamation of His Majesty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above And it is to be clearly understood, that this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majesty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlisted for general Service from the faid Forces, and shall subjequently thereto have deferted, will be included in this His Majesty's gracious Pardon.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

By His Majesty's Command,

Copenhagen, September 3, 1805. N consequence of the Reports made by Adjutant-General Ovenern, the King has ordered the Erection of Lights, with reflecting Lamps, for the Direction of Navigators in the Baltic. Most of the Ships which navigate the Baltic having occasion to pass before Christiansoe, they run the Risk of being wrecked off that Place or the neighbouring Islands. To prevent these Misfortunes, and to point out the Course which Ships ought to take, it has been thought proper to erect on the Great Tower of Christiansoe a Light composed of Nine reflecting Lamps, the Circuit of which may be made in Three Minutes; fo that, when the Nine large Lights are feen in the Dillance, it requires about Twenty Seconds to pass from one to another. The Lights will disappear in the Intervals, but may always be seen, unless the Vessel be at too great a Distance. These Lights are to be placed at the Height of Ninety-two Feet above the Level of the Sea. Elevation has been adopted to prevent this Beacon from being mistaken for that which has stood for some Years at the Northern Point of the Isle of



Bornholm, and in which the Light is made by a Coal Fire. This Light is Two Hundred and Seventy-two Feet above the Level of the Sea, and, in clear Weather, may be distinctly seen Five or Six Miles off at Sea. The Lights at Christiansoe will be displayed, for the first Time, on the 1st of Octother 1805, and will be kept up, conformable to the Ordonnance of the 21st of March 1705, and the Proclamation of 1st February 1799, that is to say, from Easter to Michaelmas, from one hour after sunset to Sun-rise; and in Winter, from Half an Hour after Sun-let to Sun-rife.
