Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Robert Tomlinson,
Commander of His Majesty's Gun-Brig the Dexterous, to William Marsden, Esq; dated in Gibraltar-Bay, the 12th September 1805.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, for their Lordships' Information, that, cruizing pursuant to Orders from Sir William Bolton, Bart. on the 11th Invant, about One A. M., the Rock of Gibraltar bearing about N. N. W. Two Leagues, I fell in with and captured the Gun-Boat No. 4, Lieut. Nicholas Magorga, Commander, carrying One long Twenty-four-Pounder, One Carronade, and Thirty-four Men; we likewise took Seven Merchant Vessels of the Convoy, which are all arrived safe in this Roadstead; they were from Malaga bound to Algeziras. It is with great Pleasure that I have to report to their Lordships the Zeal and Activity with which every Officer and Man did his Duty on this Occasion; and when their Lordships are informed that these Vessels were taken in the Face of Eight of the Enemy's Arnued Vessels who had Charge of the Convoy, and who carried near Three Hundred Men, I most humbly hope my Conduct will meet their Lordships' Approbation.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majetty's Regular Forces.

War Office, October 8, 1805.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are, at this Time, several Deserters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces

who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Ma-jesty's gracious Pardon, and that such London. Bedford. an Instance of His Royal Clemency Ipswich. would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majelty Maidftone, Exeter. Marlborough. has been graciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces Southampton, Hereford. who shall surrender themselves, on or before the Eighth Day of December next, to any of His Majesty's Shrewfoury. Birmingham. Nottingham. Civil Magistrates, to the Command-Leeds. ing Officer of any Regiment, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin Carifle, Durham. Edinburgh. Glafgow. Aberdeen. hereof, or to the Inspector-General of Inverness. the Recruiting Service in the Isle of Wight.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to command, and, when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

Every Deferter not actually ferving in any of His | Majesty's Regiments is to surrender himself for General Service.

Deferters ferving in other Corps, (Militia, and Army of Referve excepted,) are to continue therein upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers, who are to report the Circumflance to the Secretary at War and the Adjutant-General, and they shall not be liable at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served: but this Clause is not to extend to Deserters enlisted by the Corps for raising Recruits for general Service, which Deserters are only to be entitled to their Pardon, on declaring themselves to be such, and will be transferred to such Regiments as His Majesty may be pleased to com-

The Magistrate to whom any Deserter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorised and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himfelf, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Poll, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magiltrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer com-

manding at fuch Military Poll.

No Soldier who may desert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who surrendered himself upon any former Proclamation of His Majesty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above And it is to be clearly understood, that this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majesty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlisted for general Service from the faid Forces, and shall subsequently thereto have deserted, will be included in this His Majesty's gracious Pardon.
