Admiralty-Office, October 15, 1805. Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Robert Tomlinson, Commander of His Majesty's Gun-Brig the Dex-terous, to William Marsden, Esq; dated in Gibral-tar-Bay, the 12th September 1805.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, for their Lordships' Information, that, cruizing pursuant to Orders from Sir William Bolton, Bart. on the tith Infant, about One A. M., the Rock of Gibraltar bearing about N. N. W. Two Leagues, I fell in with and captured the Gun-Boat No. 4, Lieut. Nicholas Magorga, Commander, carrying One long Twenty-four-Pounder, One Carronade, and Thirty four Men; we likewise took Seven Merchant Vessels of the Convoy, which are all arrived fafe in this Roadstead; they were from Malaga bound to Algeziras. It is with great Pleasure that I have to report to their Lordships the Zeal and Activity with which every Officer and Man did his Duty on this Occasion; and when their Lordships are informed that these Vessels were taken in the Face of Eight of the Enemy's Armed Vessels who had Charge of the Convoy, and who carried near Three Hundred Men, I most humbly hope my Conduct

will meet their Lordships' Approbation.

Dublin-Cassle, October 5, 1805. His Majesty, by His Royal Letter, having appointed the Right Honorable Charles Long to be of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council of Ireland, he this Day in Council took the usual Oaths, and his Place at the Board, accordingly.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Forces.

War-Office, October 8, 1805. HEREAS it has been represented to the VV King, that there are, at this Time, several Deserters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces

who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Ma-jesty's gracious Pardon, and that such London. Bedford. an Instance of His Royal Clemency Ipswich. would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majelty Maidftone, Exeter. Marlborough. has been graciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces Southampton, Hereford. who shall surrender themselves, on or before the Eighth Day of December next, to any of His Majesty's Shrewfoury. Birmingham. Nottingham. Civil Magistrates, to the Command-Leeds. ing Officer of any Regiment, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin Carifle, Durham. Edinburgh. Glafgow. Aberdeen. hereof, or to the Inspector-General of Inverness. the Recruiting Service in the Isle of Wight.

Such Deserters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiments as His Majetty may be pleased to command, and, when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.
