Copy of a Letter from the Hononable William Corn-evallis, Admiral of the White, & c. to William Marfden, Efg; dated Ville de Paris, at Sea, the 21fl of OBober 1805.

SIR, HAVE the Honor to enclose, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter I have now received from Captain Lavie, of His Majefty's Ship Iris, giving an Account of his having fallen in with and captured the St. Pedro Spanish Corvette Privateer, and recapstured the Magdalen belonging to Greenock.

Iris, at Sea, Odober 21, 1805. 3 I R, I HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that, at Daybreak on the 15th Inflant, being off Les Roche Bonnes, Two Sail were difcovered fleering towards Bourdeaux. It was foon afcertained that one was a Schooner Armed Veffel, the other, a Merchant Ship, her Prize. Though it blew ftrong on the Shore, I was fortunate enough to cut off the Ship. She proved to be the Magdalen of Greenock, who had feparated from the Leeward Island Convoy, and had been nearly a Month in Poffeffion of the Enemy

On the fame Night a Ship opened his Fire upon me, and did not furrender until the had received feveral Broadfides. She proved to be the St. Pedro Spanish Corvette Privateer, mounting Sixteen Guns, Eight of which are Eighteen Pounders, the reft Spanish Six-Pounders, with One Hundred and Fifty Men on board when the failed, Part of whom were distributed in Five Vessels she had cap-tured. I am forry to add that we had one Man killed, and the Enemy Two killed and Four wound-The fenior Lieutenant, Mr. Ivie, and the reft ed. of the Officers and Ship's Company, conducted themfelves on this Occasion much to my Satiffaction.
