A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

W HEREAS Our Parliament flands prorogued to Thurfday the Twenty-eighth Day of this inflant November, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publifle and declare, That the faid Parliament fhall be further prorogued on the faid Twenty-eighth Day of this inflant November to Tuefday the Seventh Day of January next : And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commiftion for proroguing the fame accordingly : And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforefaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, that the faid Parliament fhall, on the faid Seventh Day of January next, be held, and fit for the Difpatch of diverfe urgent and important Affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commiftioners for Shires and Burghs of the Houfe of Commons, are kereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Weftminfter on the faid Seventh Day of January next.

A PROCLAMATION, For a General Thankfgiving.

GEORGE R.

W E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indipendable Uuty which We owe to Almighty God, for the recent and fignal Interpolition of His good Providence, in addition to the manifold and ineffimable Benefits which these Kingdoms have from Time to Time received at His Hands, manifelted by the Bleffing beflowed on Our Arms in the late fignal and important Victory obtained by Our Fleet under the Command of the late Vice Ad miral Lord Vifcount Nelfon, over the Combined Fleets of France and Spain, have thought fit, by

the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our-Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Thursday the Fifth Day of December next; and, for the better and more orderly solemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Molt Reverend the Archbishops, and Right Reverend the Bishops, of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to the Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of public Worship, and to take Care for the timely dispersing of the fame throughout their respective Diocefes: And We do firstly charge and command, that the faid public Day of Thauksfiring be religiously observed by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of suffering such Punishment as We may justly inflict upon all such who shall contemn or neglest the fame.

For a Public Thank/giving,

W E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indifpentable Duty which We owe to Almighty God, for the recent and fignal Interpofition of His good Providence, in addition to the manifold and incilimable Benefits which thefe Kingdoms have from Time to Time received at His Hands, manifelled by the Bleffing beltowed on Our Arms in the late fignal and important Victory obtained by Our Fleet, under the Command of the late Vice-Admiral Lord Vifcount Nelfon, over the Combined Fleets of France and Spain, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to illue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that a public Thankfgiving to Almighty God, for thefe His Mercies, be obferved throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scot-land, upon Thurfday the Fitth Day of December next: And We do flricity charge and command, that the faid public Thankligiving be reverently and decently observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Fifth Day of December next. as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the Performance of fo religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleafure is, therefore, and We charge, that this our Proclamation feen, ye for thwich pais to the Market Crois of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance : And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Co pies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Re galities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Copies thereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that, upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately alter Divine Service.

# A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, bear-VV ing Date the Sixteenth of May, One thou-fand eight hundred and three, We were pleafed to promife and declare, among other Things, That all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who fhould, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings cach Man as Our Royal Bounty: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounty has been by feveral Orders in Council prolonged to the Thirty first Day of December next inclusive : And whereas it has been reprefented to Us that much Advantage would arife to Our Service if the faid Bounty were extended to fuch young Able-bodied Landmen as may hereafter enter themfelves to ferve on board Our Fleet, upon Proof being exhibited of their being not lefs than Eighteen Years of Age, instead of Twenty Years; We do hereby promile and declare, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, that all Able-badied Landmen fo entering themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of De cember next, inclusive, shall be entitled to receive Our faid Hou ity of Thirty Shillings each Man. upon Proof being exhibited that fuch Able-bodied Landmen are not above the Age of Thirty-five, not under the Age of Eighteen Years: And whereas, by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth of February last, We were pleased to promise and declare, that, instead of the Reward theretofore paid

for the Difcovery of every Able and Ordinary Sea-man fit to ferve on board Our Ships; and who might conceal him or themfelves, a Reward of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board Our Ships, should be paid in Manner directed by Our faid Proclamation to any Perfon who should discover fuch Seaman or Seamen respectively, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for Our Service by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men on or before the Thirty first Day of December next; And whereas it hath been represented to Us that Advantage would avite to Our Service if fome Encouragement were also given to such Person or Per-fons as may be disposed to procure Men for the Service of Our Fleet, We do hereby further promife and declare, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, that a Reward of Four Guinéas for every Able Seaman, Three Guineas for every Ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman, shall be paid to any Person or Persons who may, on or before the Thirty-first Day of Decomber next, inclusive, procure the voluntary Service of, and convey, such Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman, fit for Our Naval Service, on board any of Our Ships or Veffels, or to any of Our. Sea Officers employed in railing Men; together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Man may respectively travel to the nearest of Our Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of Our Sea-Officers employed in raising Men (provided fuch Man shall be found fit for Our Service, and there shall not be Reason to suppose that he is an Apprentice); the faid Rewards and Travelling Allowance to be paid for any fuch Able Seaman or Seamen, Ordinary Seaman or Landman, respectively, fo procured and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy; and at the Out Ports, by the Naval Officers (where there are any), and (where there are no Naval Officers) by the Collector of Our Customs, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Of-ficers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors of Our Cuttoms respectively, by the Person who may procure the voluntary Service of any Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names, and Numbers and Quality, of Seamen and Landmen fo procured; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take Charge of fuch Seaman or Landman for Our Service.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for "making-further Provision for the effectual Per-



" formance of Quarantine ;" it is, amongit other Things, enacted, That, from and after the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and five, all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as all others, coming from, or having touched at any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and de clared it probable that the Plague, or any other in fections Difeafe or Diffemper, highly dangerous to the Health of His Majelty's Subjects, may be brought, and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Perfon, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books. Letteas, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels lo coming from, or having touched at such infected Place as aforefaid, whether such Perfons, Goods, Warcs and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, shall have come, or been brought in fuch Ships or Vellels, or fuch Perfons Itall have gone, or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships or Vessels at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether such Ships or Vessels were or were not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and that all Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any Articles whatever, on board any fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from, or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or on board of any fuch Receiving Ships, Veffels, or Boats as aforefaid, shall be, and be confidered to be liable to Quarantine within the Meaning of the faid Act, and of any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majelty. His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection from the Time of the Departure of fuch Ships or Veffels from fuch Infected Place as aforefaid, or from the Time when fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, fhall have been received on board respectively; and that such Ships, Vessels, and Boats as aforesaid, and all Persons, (as well Pilous as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, from fuch Infected Place as aforefaid, or going, or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and all Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on hoard any fuch Receiving Ship, Veffel, or Boat as aforefaid, shall, upon their Arrival at any such Port or Place, be obliged to perform Quarantine in fuch Place or Places, for fuch Time and in fuch Manner, as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majetty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or pub-lished in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, Perfons, Goods, Wares and, Merchandize, and other Atticles as aforefaid, shall have respectively performed, and shall be duly discharged from such Quarantine, no such Person, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other Articles

as aforefaid, or any of them, shall, either before or after the Arrival of such Ships, Vessels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, come or be brought on Shore, or go, or be put on board any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to-come or be brought on Shore, in any fuch Port or Place, although fuch Ships or Vessels to coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, may not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, unlefs in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majelty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, in Council asaforefaid ; and that all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats, whether coming from such infected Place as aforefaid, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, and all Per-fons, (as well Pilots as others.) Goods. Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in Inch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, or going, or being put on board the fame; either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships? Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, and although fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats shall not he bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid; and that all Commanders, Makers, or other Perfons having the Charge or Command of any fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, whether coming from any infected Place, or being otherwise liable to Quaran-tine as aforefaid, shall be subject to all the Provisions, Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions contained in the faid Act, or in any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majelty, His Heirs, and Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and to all the Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punishments contained in the faid Act, for any Breach or Difubedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majelty in Council, made under the Authority thereof: And whereas Information hath been received that an infectious Difease hath lately shewn itself in various Parts of the Continent of America, and particularly in the Diftrict of Southwark, in the City of Philadelphia, and in the City of New York : His Majeltv, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon adjudge and declare it probable, that the faid infectious Difeale is highly dangerous to the Health of His Majelty's Subjects, and may be brought into fome Port or Place in Great Bri-tain, or the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Mau, by Ships or Veffels coming from, or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Penfylvania, or the State of New York ; and is thereupon pleafed to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as others (not having the faid infectious Difeafe on board,) coming from, or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Penfylvania or the State of New York, do perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prefcribed by His Majelly's Orders in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April last, concerning the Per-formance of Quarantine by all Ships ard Vessels coming from or through the Mediterraneau, or from the Well Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent t but in cafe it shall

appear upon the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel com-, ] ing from or having touched at any of the Ports within the fuid States of Penfylvania and New York, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the Tame have died, or been ill of fuch infectious Difeafe, within the Space of Forty Days, prior to the Ar-rival of fuch Ship or Veffel on the Coafts of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alder-ney, Sark, or Man; or in cafe any Perfon thall have , died on board fuch Ship or Vessel, in consequence of the faid Infectious Diftemper, within the Space of Forty Days, as aforefaid . then and in that cafe the faid Ship or Veffel, and her Cargo, shall perform Quarantine at Standgate Creek, and thall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which the may have arrived, or thall arrive, and thall repair to Stangate Creek, and there perform Quarantine, and not elfewhere; and fhall be fubject to all the Rules and Regulations to which Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Welt Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, and not being furnished with Clean Bills of Health, are subject and liable to : And the Lords Commissioners of His Majelty's Tseafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively apper-tain. WHEREAS it is expedient that the Rules and Regulations contained in Sec. 42, of His Majefty's Örder in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April last, to afcertain whether certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, enumerated in the First Class of the faid Order, and imported in any Ship coming from any Port or Place in Europe, without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Establishment for the Performance of Quarantine, declared fuf ficient by His Majefty in Council, for that Purpofe, are, or are not. of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary, on the Atlantic Ocean, fhould be extended to Ships coming from the Island of Newfoundland, Cape Bre-ton, and other Islands adjacent to the Continent of America : His Majefty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, That all the Rules and Regulations contained in the faid 42d Sect. of the faid above recited Order, be extended (and the fame are hereby extended) to all Ships and Veffels, having on board any of the faid Art cles, and arriving in any of the Ports of Great Brit in, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alder-ney, Sark, or Man; from any of the Ports in the

Islands of Newfoundland and Cape Breton, and other Islands adjacent to the Continent of America ; Aud the Lords Commissioners of His Majelty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faud Islands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

SEND the inclosed Letter for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th of laft Month, now received from the Honorable Charles E. Fleming, Captain of His Majefty's Ship Egyptienne, making known to me, that he had fallen in with, and captured, on the Night of the 2d, the French National Brig, L'Acteon, of Sixteen Guns, and One Hundred and Twenty fix Men.

The Egyptienne having feen her Prize into Plymouth, returned to her Station.

His Majefly's Ship Egyptienne, Plymouth Sound, 8th Odober, 1805:

SIR, HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that His Majefty's Ship under my Command, captured, on the Night of the 2d Instant, the French Imperial Brig, L'Acteon, of Sixteen Guns and One Hundred and Twenty-fix Men, Two Hours after fhe left the Anchorage off Rochelle.

Having in the Morning reconnoitred the Port of Rochefort, in pursuance of your Orders, and per-ceiving L'Acteon apparently ready for Sea, in a Situation where I thought it practicable to bring her out, I refolved to accept of the very handsome Offer of Lieutenant Haudfield to make the Attempt, and flood off to the N. W. till Sunfet. At Fight P. M. returned into the Pertuis d'Antioche, intending to anchor in the Rade de Basque, to support the Boats which were prepared for this Enterprise, when the Brig was perceived, under all Sail, Outfide, and feil into our Poffession after a short Chase.

L'Acteon was commanded by Monfieur Depoge, Capitaine de Fregate ; and had on board a Colonel and fome Recruits, with Arms and Cloathing for a Regiment in the Weft Indies.

who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majeity's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Inflance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour ; His Majelty has been gracioully pleafed to grant His Free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces

who shall furrender themselves, on or before the Eighth Day of December next, to any of His Majefty's Civil Magistrates, to the Command-ing Officer of any Regiment, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whole Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Inspector-General of the Recruiting Service in the Isle of Wight.

Such Deferters, if able bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiment as His Majelly may be pleafed to command, and, when fo placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

Every Deferter not actually ferving in any of His Majefty's Regiments is to surrender himfelf for General Service.

Defenters ferving in other Corps, (Militia, and Army of Referve excepted,) are to continue therein upon declaring themfelves to their respective Commanding Officers, who are to report the Circumflance to the Secretary at War and the Adjutant-General, and they shall not be liable at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved : but this Claufe is not to extend to Deferters enlifted by the Corps for railing Recruits for general Service, which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon, on declaring themselves to be fuch, and will be transferred to fuch Regiments as His Majefty may be pleafed to command.

The Magistrate to whom any Deferter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may furrender himfelf, is authorifed and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter forrendered himfelf, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head Quarters of the nearest Military Poll, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unleis prevented by Sicknels, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magiltrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at fuch Military Polt.

No Soldier who may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall b e included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who furrendered himfelf upon any former Proclamation of His Majefty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above Pardon. And it is to be clearly underflood, that this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majetty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlitted for general Service from the faid Forces, and fhall fubiequently thereto have deferted, will be included in this His Majelty's gracious Pardon.
