SINCE my Letter to you of the 24th, stating the Proceedings of His Majesty's Squadron, our Situation has been the most critical, and our Employment the most arduous that ever a Fleet was engaged in. On the 24th and 25th it blew a most violent Gale of Wind, which completely dispersed the Ships, and drove the captured Hulls in all Directions.

I have since been employed in collecting and deftroying them, where they are at Anchor upon the Coast between Cadiz and Six Leagues Westward of San Lucar, without the Prospect of faving One to

bring into Port.

I mentioned in my former Letter the joining of the Donegal and Melpomene, after the Action; I cannot sufficiently praise the Activity of their Commanders, in giving Assistance to the Squadron in dellroying the Enemy's Ships.

The Defiance, after having stuck to the Aigle, as long as it was possible, in hope of saving her from Wreck, which separated her for some Time from the Squadron, was obliged to abandon her to her Fate, and she went on Shore.

morrow, if the Weather keeps moderate.

In the Gale the Royal Sovereign and Mars lost their Foremasts, and are now Rigging anew, where the Body of the Squadron is at Anchor to the N. W. of San Lucar.

I find that on the Return of Gravina to Cadiz, he was immediately ordered to Sea again, and came out, which made it necessary for me to form a Line, to cover the disabled Hulls-that Night it blew hard, and his Ship, the Prince of Asturias, was dismasted, and returned into Port; the Rayo was also dismasted, and fell into our Hands; Don Enrique M'Donel, had his Broad Pendant in the Rayo, and from him I find the Santa Ana was driven near .Cadiz, and towed in by a Frigate.

SIR, ENCLOSE, for the Information of their Lordships, the Copy of a Letter to me from Captain Wolfe, giving an Account of an Attack made on the Aigle by some Spanish Gun-Boats in Vigo-Bay. I have the Honor to be, &c.

SIR, Aigle, November 3, 1805. BEING becalmed in Vigo Bay, on the 28th of September last, at Eight A. M. a Squadron of Nine Spanish Gun-Boats attacked His Majesty's Frigate under my Command. At Nine, a Breeze fprung up: Reversed their Attack into a hasty Retreat; but, from their Proximity to the Shore, we only captured one of them, carrying a long Twenty-four-Pounder, commanded by Don Josef Maria Galon, Four Artillery Men, and Twenty-four Sea-The Aigle sustained no other Damage than a few Shot through the Sails.

SIR. HEREWITH transmit, for their Lordships' Information, a Copy of a Letter which I have received from Captain Hancock, of His Majesty's Sloop the Cruizer, reporting the Capture of Le Vengeur French Privateer, one of the Enemy's Cruizers that has lately infested the Coast from Leostoffe towards the Galloper.

His Majesty's Sloop Cruizer, in the Downs, ORD, 13th of November, 1805. My Lord, HAVE the Honor to acquaint your Lordship, that, last Night at Seven P. M. stretching across from the North Sand Head to resume my Station off Flushing, we fell in with Two Luggers, which suffered us to approach them quite close. One of them was, at this Time, in the Act of boarding a Brig to Windward, within Gun-shot, and the other ran athwart our Bow, within hail, for the Purpose of boarding us to Leeward, taking us for a Merchant Vessel. This being the largest, I made my first Object, and, after a Chace of Two Hours, all the Time within Musket-shot, and under Fire of our Bow Guns and Muskets, I had the good Fortune to bring down her Main topsail and Main-lugsail, when she struck, and proved to be Le Vengeur French Privateer Lugger, of Fourteen Guns and Fifty-fix Men, commanded by Jean Augustin Hirrel, Two Days out from Boulogne, and had, on the Afternoon of the Day on which he was captured, taken Two Swedish Brigs, one laden with Salt, from Liverpool, the other from Boston in Lincolnshire, in Ballast. She

is a beautiful new Lugger, and esteemed the fastest failing Veffel out of France.

BEG Leave to inform the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Rose, of His Majesty's Ship Circe, given an Account of the Capture of La Constance Schooner Privateer from Guadaloupe; this is the same Vessel formerly taken by the Circe off the Coast of Spain, but re-captured to Windward of this Island; she had just left Guadaloupe, and her Trim was not known; she is a remarkable fine Vessel.

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you of my having fallen in with a Franch P. fallen in with a French Privateer Schooner, on the 17th of May last, the Island of Berbuda bearing South, distant Five or Six Leagues, which, after a Chace of Five Hours, I captured. She proved to be Le Teazer of Seven Guns and Fifty-one Men, belonging to Guadaloupe, commanded by Joseph Ratisque, who was badly wounded by a Grape Shot. Out on a Three Month's Cruife, and had

His Majesty's Armed Sloop Dominica, SIR, off Roseau, Sept. 5, 1805. HAVE the Honor to inform you His Majesty's

Armed Sloop Dominica, under my Command, captured on the 25th Ultimo, after a Chace of some Hours, under the Lee of this Island, La Ravanche, a French Row-Boat Privateer, mounting a Twelve-Pounder Carronade in the Bow, and several Swivels; having on board at the Time of Capture but Fifteen Men. She had been Eight Weeks from Guadaloupe, and had taken Three small Vessels:

Also, on 2d Instant, at Eight A. M. the Saints bearing N. E. by E. distant about Five Leagues, another Row-Boat, named La Prudente, having got within Reach of the Dominica's Guns without discovering her to be an Armed Veffel, it being calm, I dispatched Mr. Jackson, Midshipman, with Eight Men, all Volunteers, to attack her in the Boat, at the same Time anneying her in her Retreat by a Fire of Grape and Canniller from the Sloop. At Ten, when about Two Leagues from us, the Boat came up with her, and, after exchanging a few Vollies of Musketry, the Enemy struck. She was one Day from the Saints, having on board Sixteen Men, well equipped. I am happy to fay that only One Man was hurt on the Occasion, James Morgan, whose Collar-Bone was broke.

PROCLAMATION for pardoning Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Forces.

War Office, Odober 8, 1805. HEREAS it has been represented to the King, that there are, at this Time, several Deferters from His Majesty's Regular Land Forces

who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; His Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deserters from His Regular Land Forces who shall surrender themselves, on or before the Eighth Day of December next, to any of His Majesty's Civil Magistrates, to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Inspector-General of the Recruiting Service in the Isle of Wight.

Such Deserters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiment as His Majesty may be pleased to command, and, when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other, Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

Every Deferter not actually serving in any of His. Majesty's Regiments is to surrender himself for General Service.

Deferters ferving in other Corps, (Militia, and Army of Reserve excepted,) are to continue therein upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding. Officers, who are to report the Circumstance to the Secretary at War and the Adjutant-General, and they shall not be liable at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly served: but this Clause is not to extend to Deferters enlifted by the Corps for raising Recruits for general Service, which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon, on declaring themselves to be such, and will be transferred to such Regiments as His Majelly may be pleased to com-

The Magiltrate to whom any Deferter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may surrender himself, is authorised and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himself, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deserter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Post, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unless prevented by Sickness, to be certified by some Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magillate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer com-

manding at fuch Military Post.

No Soldier who may defert after these His Majesty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who surrendered himself upon any former Proclamation of His Majelty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above And it is to be clearly understood, that Pardon. this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majesty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlisted for general Service from the faid Forces, and shall subsequently thereto have deserted, will be included in this His Majesty's gracious Pardon.
