W HEREAS Our Parliament flands prorogued to Thurfday the Twenty-eighth Day of this inflant November, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publific and declare, That the faid Parliament fhall be further prorogued on the faid Twenty eighth Day of this inflant November to Tuefday the Seventh Day of January next : And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commiftion for proroguing the fame accordingly : And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforefaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, that the faid Parliament fhall, on the faid Seventh Day of January next, be held, and fit for the Difpatch of diverfe urgent and important Affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burges of the Houfe of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Weftminfter on the

A PROCLAMATION, For a General Thank fgiving.

W E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indifferfable Duty which We owe to Almighty God, for the recent and 'fignal Interpolition of His good Providence, in addition to the manifold and ineffimable Benefits which these Kingdoms have from Time to Time received at His Hands, manifested by the Bleffing bestowed on Our Arms in the late fignal and important. Victory obtained by Our Fleet under the Command of the late-Vice-Admiral Lord Viscount Nelson, over the Combined Fleets of France and Spain, have thought fit, by

the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a General Thankigiving to Almighty God, for thefe His Mercies, be observed throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Thursday the Fifth Day of December next; and, for the better and more orderly folemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and Right Reverend the Bishops, of England, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to the Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of public Worship; and to take Care for the timely dispersing of the fame throughout their respective Diocetes: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid public Day of Thanksfiving be religiously observed by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of fuffering such Punishment as We may justly instict upon all such who shall contemn or negles the fame.

A PROCLAMATION, For a Public Thankfgiving,

W.E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indifpensable Duty which We owe to Almighty God, for the recent and fignal Interpofition of His good Providence, in addition to the manifold and ineffimable Benefits which these Kingdoms have from Time to Time received at His Hands, manifested by the Bleffing bestowed on Our Arms in the late fignal and important Victory obtained by Our Fleet, under the Command of the late Vice-Admiral Lord Viscount Nelson, over the Combined Fleets of France and Spain, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to illue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that a public Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scot-land, upon Thurfday the Fifth Day of December next: And We do strictly charge and command, that the faid public Thanksgiving be reverently and decently observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Fifth Day of December next, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the Performance of fo religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleasure is, therefore, and We charge, that this our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pals to the Market Crols of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, that Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Copies thereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that, upon the Lord's Day imme-diately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, bear-ing Date the Sixteenth of May, One thou-fland eight hundred and three, We were pleafed to promife and declare, among other Things, That all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who fhould, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as Our Royal Bounty: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounty has been by feveral Orders in Council prolonged to the Thirty first Day of December next inclusive: And whereas it has been represented to Us that much Advantage would arife to Our Service if the faid Bounty were extended to fuch young Able-bodied Landmen as may hereafter enter themfelves to ferve on board Our Fleet, upon Proof being exhibited of their being not lefs than Eighteen Years of Age, inftead of Twenty Years; We do hereby promife and declare, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, that all Able-bodied Landmen fo entering themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of De cember next, inclusive, shall be entitled to receive Our faid Bounty of Thirty Shillings each Man, upon Proof being exhibited that such Able-bodied Landmen are not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor-under the Age of Eighteen Years: And whereas, by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth of February last, We were pleafed to promife and declare, that, instead of the Reward theretofore paid "

for the Difcovery of every Able and Ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board Our Ships; and who might conceal him or themselves, a Reward of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Fifty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board Our Ships, fhould be paid in Manner directed by Our faid Proclamation to any Perfon who should difcover fuch Seaman or Seamen respectively, who might. conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for Our Service by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men on or: before the Thirty-first Day of December next : And whereas it hath been reprefented to Us that Advantage would arife to Our Service if fome Encouragement were also given to fuch Perfon or Per-fons as may be disposed to procure Men for the Service of Our Fleet, We do hereby further promife and declare, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, that a Reward of Four Guineas for every Able Seaman, Three Guineas for every Ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman, shall be paid to any Person or Persons who may, on or before the Thirty-first Day of December uext, inclusive, procure the voluntary Service of, and convey, fuch Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman, fit for Our Naval Service, on board any of Our Ships or Veffels, or to any of Our Sea Officers employed in raifing Men; together with an Allowance, at the Rate of One Penny per Mile, for each Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile fuch Man may respectively travel to the nearest of Our Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of Our Sea-Officers employed in raifing Men (provided fuch Man shall be found fit for Our Service, and there Thall not be Reafon to fuppofe that he is an Apprentice); the faid Rewards and Travelling Allowance to be paid for any fuch Able Seaman or Seamen, Ordinary Seaman or Landman respectively, to procured and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy; and at the Out Ports, by the Naval Officers (where there are any), and (where there are no Naval Officers) by the Collector of Our Cuftoms, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Of-ficers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors of Our Cultoms respectively, by the Perfon who may procure the voluntary Service of any Able Seaman, Ordinary Seaman, or Landman as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names, and Numbers and Quality, of Seamen and Landmen fo procured; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take Charge of fuch Seaman or Landman for Our Service.

P R E S E N T, The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for "making-further Provision for the effectual Per-

" formance of Quarantine ;" it is, amonght other. Things, enacted, That, from and after the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and five, all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majefty's Ships of War as all others, coming from, or having touched at any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall have adjudged and de--clared it probable that the Plague, or any other in--fectious Difeafe or Diftemper, highly dangerous to "the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, may be brought, and all Ships, Veffels, and Boats receiving any Perfon, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Let-ters, or any other Articles whatever, from or out of any Ships or Veffels to coming from, or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, whether fuch Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, shall have come, or been brought in ifuch Ships or Vessels, or fuch Persons shall have gone, or Articles have been put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships or Veffels at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and whether such Ships or Vessels were or were not bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Iflands aforefaid; and that all Perfons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or any Articles whatever, on board any fuch Ships or Vellels to coming from, or having touched at fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or on board of any fuch Receiving Ships, Veffels, or Boats as aforefaid, shall be, and be confidered to be liable to Quarantine within the Meaning of the faid Act, and of any Or-der or Orders which shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of 'His or Their Privy Council concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection from the Time of "the Departure of luch Ships or Vessels from luch Infected Place as aforelaid, or from the Time when fuch Perlons, Goods, Wares, Merchandize, Packets, Packages, Baggage, Wearing Apparel, Books, Letters, or other Articles, shall have been received on board refpectively; and that fuch Ships, Veffels, and Boats as aforefaid, and all Perfons, (as well Pilots as others), Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, from fuch Infected Place as aforefaid, or going, or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and all Perlons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, on board any fuch Receiving Ship, Veffel, or Boat as aforefaid, fhall, upon their Arrival at any fuch Port or Place, be obliged to perform Quarantine in fuch Place or Places, for fuch Time and in fuch Manner, as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successfors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until such Ships, Veffels, and Boats, Persons, Goods, Wares and Merchandize, and other Atticles as aforefaid, shall have respectively performed, and shall be duly discharged from such Quarantine, no such Person, Goods, Wares, or Merchandize, or other Articles

as aforefaid, or any of them, shall, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Vessels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, come or be brought on Shore, or go, or be put on board any other Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to come or be brought on Shore, in any fuch Port or Place, although fuch Ships or Veffels fo coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, may not be bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands, aforefaid, unless in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty; His Heirs, or Succeffors, in Council asaforefaid ; and that all fuch Ships, Veflels, and Boats, whether coming from fuch infected Place as aforefaid, or being otherwife liable to Quarantine as aforcfaid, and all Per-fons, (as well Pilots as others,) Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles as aforefaid, whether coming or brought in fuch Ships, Vefiels, or Boats, or going, or being put on board the fame, either before or after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats, at any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid, and although fuch Ships, Veffels, or Boats shall not he bound to any Port or Place in Great Britain, or the Islands aforefaid; and that all Commanders, Masters, or other Perfons having the Charge or Command of any fuch Ships, Vessels, or Boats, whether coming from any infected Place, or being otherwife liable to Quaran-tine as aforefaid, shall be subject to all the Provisions, Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions contained in the faid Act, or in any Order or Orders which shall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs, and Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid, concerning Quarantine and the Prevention of Infection, and to all the Pains, Penalties, Forfeitures, and Punifhments contained in the faid Act, for any Breach or Difobedience thereof, or of any Order or Orders of His Majelty in Council, made under the Authority thereof: And whereas Information hath been received that an infectious Difease hath lately shewn itself in various Parts of the Continent of America, and par-ticularly in the Diltrict of Southwark, in the City of Philadelphia, and in the City of New York : His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon adjudge and declare it probable, that the faid infectious Difeafe is highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, and may be brought into fome Port or Place in Great Bri-tain, or the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, by Ships or Veffels coming from, or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Penfylvania, or the State of New York ; and is thereupon pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Veffels, as well His Majelty's Ships of War as others (not having the faid, infectious Difeafe on board,) coming from, or having touched at any of the Ports within the State of Penfylvania or the State of New York, do perform a Quarantine of Fifteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prefcribed by His Majefly's Orders in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April laft, concerning the Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain, without the Streights of Gibraltar lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent: but in case it shall

sappear.upon the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel com. ing from or having touched at any of the Ports within the faid States of Penfylvania and New York, that any of the Crew or Pallengers belonging to the fame have died, or been ill of fuch infectious Dileale, within the Space of Forty Days, prior to the Arrival of fuch Ship or Veffel on the Coafts of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jerley, Alder-ney; Sark, or Man; or in cale any Person shall have died on board fuch Ship or Veffel, in confequence of the faid Infectious Diftemper, within the Space of Forty Days, as aforefaid ; then and in that cafe, the faid Ship or Veffel, and her Cargo, shall perform Quarantine at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which fhe may have arrived, or fhall arrive, and fhall repair to Stangate Creek, and there perform Qua-rantine, and not eliewhere; and shall be subject to . all the Rules and Regulations to which Ships and Welfels coming from or through the Mediterrauean, or from the Welt Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain, without the Streights of a ibraltar, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, and not being furnished with Clean Bills of Health, are subject and liable to: And the Lords Commifficaers of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, : the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and, the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Illes of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Di-.rections herein, as to them may respectively apper-Steph. WHEREAS it is expedient that the Rules and Regulations contained in Sec. 42, of His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April last, to ascertain whether certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, enumerated in the First Class of the faid Order, and imported in any Ship coming from any. Port or . Place in Europe, without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular Eftablishment for the Performance of Quarantine, declared fufficient by His Majefty in Council, for that Purpole,. are, or are not, of the Growth, Produce, or Manu-"facture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the Weft Barbary, . on the Atlantic Ocean, should be extended to Ships coming from the Mand of Newfoundland, Cape Breton, and other Islands adjacent to the Continent of America : His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, That all the Rules and Regulations contained in the faid 42d Sect. of the faid above recited Order, be extended (and the fame are hereby extended) to all Ships and Veffels, having on board any of the faid Articles, and arriving in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alder-

ney, Sark, or Man; from any of the Ports in the Islands of Newfoundlaud and Cape Breton, and other Islands adjacent to the Continent of America ; And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing, the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Islands of Guernicy, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neeeffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

The Magistrate to whom any Deferter from His Majesty's Regular Forces may furrender himself, is authorifed and required to certify the Day on which such Deserter surrendered himself, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Poit, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unleis prevented by Sickneis, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwile proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at fuch Military Poft.

No Soldier who may defert after thefe His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall b e included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who surrendered himself upon any former Proclamation of His Majefty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above And it is to be clearly underftood, that Pardon. this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majefty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional'Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlisted for general Service from the faid Forces, and shall subsequently thereto have deferted, will be included in this His Majelty's gracious Pardon.
