The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honorable Edward Earl of Powis, was, by His Majefty's Command, 'fworn of His Majefty's Molt Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majefty in Council was this Day pleafed to declare the Right Honorable Edward Earl of Powls, Lieutenant General and General Governor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 21st of November 1805,

PREŠENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day of May last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of December next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms

or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth. Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled "An " Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the " Exportation of Sak-Petre, and to enforce the " Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coastwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition :"-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceflary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. WHEREAS by an AA, paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An AA " for continuing feveral Laws relating to the per-" mitting the Warehoufing of Spirits in Ireland for " Exportation, for charging a Duty on the fame " when taken out for Home Confumption, and for " regulating the Exportation to Great Britain of " Spirits not warehoufed, until the Twenty-ninth " Day of September, One thoufand eight hundred " and five; to the prohibiting the Exportation " from, and permitting the Importation to, Great

" Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importa-" tion of other Articles of Provision, without Pay-" ment of Duty; and to the prohibiting the Ex-<sup>66</sup> portation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or se other Provisions; and to the permitting the Im-" portation into Ireland of Corn, Flih, and Provi-" fions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-" fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred " and fix ;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-pinth Year of His prefent Majefty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Selfion of Parliament; which was continued by an Act of the Thirty ninth and Fortieth Years of His prefent Majefty, and amended and further continued by feveral fubfequent Acts, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and five, shall be, and the fame is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thoufand eight hundred and fix, His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day of May laft, to permit, for the Space of Six Months from the Date of the faid Order, the Importation of fundry Articles of Provisions therein specified, Duty free: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Permission should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Thirtieth Day of this inftant November, the Importation into any Port or Place of Great Britain of any Beahs called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and allo of Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; and of Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb (except falted Beef and Pork); and of Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Veffel, belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majelty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforefaid, that shall be fo imported, with the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port where the fame shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures mentioned and referred to in the faid above recited Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of, His present Majefty :--- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

**PROCLAMATION** for pardoning Deferters from His Majefty's Regular Forces.

War Office, Officer 8, 1805.

7HEREAS it has been reprefented to the VV King, that there are, at this Time, feveral Deferters from His Majefty's Regular Land Forces

London. Bedford. Ipfwich. Maidflone. Exeter. Marlborough. Southampton. Hereford. Shrew/bury. Birmingham. Nottingham. Leeds. Carlifle, Durbam. Edinburgh. Glafgow. Aberdeen. Inverness.

who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Pardon, and that fuch an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour ; His Majelty has been gracioully pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deferters from His Regular Land Forces who shall furrender themfelves, on or before the Eighth Day of December next, to any of His Majefty's Civil Magistrates, to the Command-ing Officer of any Regiment, to any of the Superintending Field Officers of the Recruiting Service, whofe Stations are mentioned in the Margin hereof, or to the Infpector-General of the Recruiting Service in the Ifle of Wight.

Such Deferters, if able-bodied Men, and fit for Service, shall be appointed to such Regiment as His Majesty may be pleased to command, and, when so placed, fhall not be hable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged. Every Deferter not actually ferving in any of His

Majefty's Regiments is to furrender himfelf for Géneral Service.

Deferters ferving in other Corps, (Militia, and Army of Referve excepted,) are to continue therein upon declaring themselves to their respective Commanding Officers, who are to report the Circum-fiance to the Secretary at War and the Adjutant-General, and they shall not be liable at any future Time, to be claimed by the Regiments in which they formerly ferved : but this Claufe is not to ex. I fplendid Atchievements.

Commissions in Volunteer Corps, figned by His Ma- I tend to Deferters enhilted by the Corps for raising Recruits for general Service, which Deferters are only to be entitled to their Pardon, on declaring themfelves to be fuch, and will be transferred to fuch Regiments as His Majefty may be pleafed to command.

The Magiltrate to whom any Deferter from His Majefty's Regular Forces may furrender himfelf, is authorifed and required to certify the Day on which fuch Deferter furrendered himfelf, which Certificate is to continue in force until the Arrival of the Deferter at the Head-Quarters of the nearest Military Poil, provided he proceed at the Rate of Ten Miles a Day, unleis prevented by Sickneis, to be certified by fome Medical Practitioner on the Back of the Magistrate's Certificate, or to be otherwife proved to the Satisfaction of the Officer commanding at fuch Military Poß.

No Soldier who may defert after these His Majefty's gracious Intentions are made public, shall be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity. Nor shall any Soldier who surrendered himself upon any former Proclamation of His Majesty's Pardon, and who afterwards again deferted, be included in the above And it is to be clearly underflood, that Pardon. this Pardon is not to extend to any Deferter from His Majefty's Militia Forces, or from the Army of Referve, or Additional Force; but all Soldiers who shall have enlisted for general Service from the faid Forces, and shall subsequently thereto have deferted, will be included in this His Majesty's gracious Pardon.

WE, your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Inhabitants of the Towns and Neighbourhood of Manchefter and Salford, humbly approach your Majefty's Throne, with our most heartfelt Congratulations on the late fplendid and unparalleled Victory obtained by your Majefty's Naval Forces over the Combined Fleets of France and Spain.

Whilk<sup>°</sup> we dwell with Admiration on thefe victorious Efforts, directed by fuch Skill, and fupported with fo much Bravery, we cannot but partake of a whole Nation's Grief, in lamenting the Death of that heroic Commander, Lord Vifcount Nellon, who, after a Life of brilliant Services, unequalled in the Annals of the Country, expired in the Arms of Victory.

But in a Series of noble Achievements he has left fuch an imperishable Memorial of the patriotic Exertions, the skilful Attainments, and undaunted Refolution of a British Commander, and of the Loyalty, Courage, and Discipline of British Seamen, as will hold forth an instructive Lesson to the vain Expectations of our Enemies, and continue to afford a glorious Example to all whose Energies may be exerted under your Majesty's triumphant Flag.
