The KING's Molt Excellent Majelty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-y, jefty's Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day VV, jefty's Order in Council of the Thirtieth Day of May laft, for proliibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwile, Gun-powder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will'expire upon the Sixth Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expe-dient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition flould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfo-over. fexcept the Mafter General of the Ordnance sver, (except the Malter General of the Ordnance for His Majefly's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of December next, prelume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaffwile, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms, or Aminunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any. Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vellel in orderto transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaffwife, without Leave or Permiflion in that Behalf firth obtained from His Majefty on His Privy Council, upon Pain of incur-ring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Pe-nalties inflicted by an Act palled in the Twenty-minth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, initialed "An "Act to empower His Majefty to prohibit the "Forportation of Salt Petre and to enforce the

WHEREAS by an AA, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An AA for continuing feveral Laws relating to the per-mitting the Warehoufing of Spirits in Ireland for Exportation, for charging a Duty on the large when taken out for Home Confumption, and for regulating the Exportation to Great Britain of Spirits not warehoused, until the Twenty-ninth Day of September, One thousand eight hundred and five; to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty'; and to the prohibiting the Ex-portation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or other Provisions; and to the permitting the Im-portation into Ireland of Corn, Fifh, and Provi-tions without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-" fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred " and fix;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majelty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without.
