His Majesty's Sloop Rein Deer, off Cape

SIR, *Mayze, the 20th of September, 1805.*  
I HAVE the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that, on  
the 13th Instant, after a Chace of upwards of  
Six Hours, I captured the French Privateer Ren-  
ommée, of Two Six-Pounders and Forty Men,  
belonging to St. Domingo, but lost from Barracoa,  
and had not taken any Thing. Much Credit  
is due to the Rein Deer's Ship's Company, for  
their strong Exertions at the Sweeps during the  
whole Chace in a very hot Day.
