To the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty.

WE, the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, and Freeholders of the County of Devon, beg Permiffion to offer our warmelt Congratulations to your. Majefty on the decifive Victory recently atchieved over the united Fleets of France and Spain, off Cape Trafalgar. We humbly acknowledge the Hand of the Almighty Giver of all Victory in the total Defruction of this Armament, affembled, with proud Boafting, for the Invalion of your Majefty's Dominions; and we blefs the fame Divine Providence for giving Succefs to the wonderful Exertions of the British Fleet against the imminent Perils of the Elements.

In common with all Ranks of your Majefly's Subjects, and the general Voice of Europe, we molt fincerely lament the Lofs of your illuftrious Admiral Lord Vifcount Nelfon; whofe Life of Exertion and profeffional Abilities, dedicated to the public Service, have been fo confpicuoufly terminated in the Moment of an unparalleled Victory : but, while we deplore the Death of this Hero, unrivalled in his Career of Glory, we cannot but gratefully reflect on the transferndant maritime Skill, and invincible Spirit, with which his patriotic Influctions were executed by your Majefly's Fleet under his Command.


