W E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the juft and neceflary War in which We are engaged, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God, that he will gracioully blefs our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, that a publick Day of Fafting and Humiliation, be obferved throughout thole Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Wednefday the Twenty-fixth Day of February next enfuing, that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and in the most devout and folemn Manner feud up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting thole heavy Judgments/which Our manifold Provocations have most juftly deferved; and for imploring his Bleffing and Affiltance on our Arms for the Reftoration of Peace, and Prosperity to Us and Our Dominions : And We do ftrictly charge and command, that the faid publick Faft be reverently and devoutly obferved by all our loving Subjects in England and Ireland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his Wrath and Indignation ; and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may juttly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and neceffary a Duty : And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Molt Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England and Ireland, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be ufed in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of publick Worship, and to take Care that the fame be timely difperfed throughout their respective Dioceles.

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleafed, by His Roval Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thousand eight hun-dred and three, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Sea-man fit for His Majelty's Service fhould be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch able and ordinary Sraman, not above the Age of Fifty not under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themfelves to terve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains, or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleased by his faid Proclamation to declare, that all able bodied Landmen not above the Age of Thirtyfive, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thousand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every able and ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him, or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Procla-mation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty first Day of December last: And whereas His Majesty was graciously pleafed by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of November laft, to promife and declare that all able bodied Landmen fo entering themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy on or before the faid Thirty first of December laft fhould be entitled to receive the faid Bounty of Thirty Shillings each Man, upon Proof being exhibited that fuch able-bodied-Landmen were not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years; and that a Reward of Three Pounds for every able Seaman and Fifty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships fhould be paid in the Manner directed hy His Majesty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth. Day of February One thousand eight hundred and five, to any Person who should discover l

conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen might be taken for His Majefty's Service by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December laft: And whereas by the faid aboverecited Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November laft, His Majefty was further pleafed to promife and declare, that a Reward of Four Guineas for every able Seaman, Three Guineas for every ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman should be paid to any Person or Persons who might, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December last, inclusive, procure the voluntary Service of, and convey fuch able Seaman or Landman fit for His Majefty's Service, on board any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or to any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each able Seaman, ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile they might respectively travel to the nearest of His Majelty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, (provided fuch Man should be fit for His Majelty's Service, and there should not be Realon to suppole, that he was an Apprentice,) the faid Rewards and travelling Allow-ance, to be paid in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation : And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards and travelling Allowance, has expired; and it is expedient that the Payment thereof fince the Thirty first of December last should be confirmed and approved, and that fuch Payment should be still further continued for fome Time longer, His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards and travelling Allowance made fince the Thirty-first Day of December last, be confirmed, and approved ; and that the like Payment be further made and continued from the Date hereof until the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive, whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern W. Fasukener. themfelves accordingly.

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and five, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, expired upon the Eleventh Day of this inftant January: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition stored be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space



of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of this of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of this inflant January, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do fhip or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, 'Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majelty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majefty " to refirain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and " more effectually to prevent the Exportation of " " Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro-" hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majelty, or employed or freighted by His Majelty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necelfary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Planta-tions in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-pofes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weil Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Ma jefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factorics in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majelty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other ; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commisfioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury,

the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain. W. Fawkener.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to His WW Majefty at this Board, that the Infectious Diforder which fome Time fince raged within the States of Pennfylvania and New York, within the United States of America, has totally cealed; His Majesty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being delirous to remove all Restraint upon Trade fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Order in Council of the Seventh Day of November laft, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes which had arrived, or which fhould thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guern-fey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports in the States of Pennfylvaniaor New York, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cale fuch Order of the Seventh Day of November last, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithftanding; provided fuch Ships and Veffels fhall have failed from the Ports in the States of PennfyLvania or New York, fubfequent to the Third Day of November laft, and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board shall have died, or been sick with the faid Fever, during the Course of the Voyage: And the Right Honorable the Lords Com. miffioners of His Majelty's Treasury, the Commif-tioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General, and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Guernley, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. Sittings in the Exchequer, after Michaelmas Term, 1805, before the Lord Chief Baron and a fpecial Jury.

MR. PLUMER, the Counfel for the Crown, Information filed in the Name of His Majefly's Attorney-General, by Order of the Cormiffioners of Stamps, against the Defendant William Bell, a Butcher, at Manchester, for baving, in the Month of October, 1804 received from a Perfon of the Name of Bartowclough, a Sheriff's Officer, allo refiding at Manchester, the Sum of 1.1, 55 6d. the Amount of a Bill delivered for Meat fold to him, and refusing, at the Tione the Money was paid, to fign a Receipt for the fame on a proper Stamp, and to pay the Duty thereon, as directed by the-Statute of the 43d of the prefent King, Cap. 126; which Act, in the 2d Section, directs, that the Stamp Duty on all Receipts shall be paid by the Perfon receiving the Money. And the 5th

Section alfo enacts; that it fhall be lawful for any Perfon, or any Agent of any Perfon, from whom any Sum of Money thall be due or payable, and who thall have paid tuch Sum of Money, to provide a Piece of Paper, duly flamped according to the Amount of the Sum to paid, or fome higher Rate of Duty in the faid Act contained, and to demand and require of the Perfor entitled to fuch Sum of Money a Receipt for the fame, and alfo the Amount of the Duty thereon; and then it provides, if any Per-lon, to whom any Sum of Money shall have been paid, shall refuse to give such Receipt upon Demand thereof, or pay the Amount of the Duty thereof, every such Person shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence the Sum of Ten Pounds .- He then obferved that this Act cafts the Obligation upon the Perfon who receives the Money to give a flamped Receipt to the Perfon paying it, or the Perfon paying the Money may tender a Receipt Stimp, and may demand of the Perlon to fign it after he has received the Money; and he has a Right alfo to demand the Payment, of the Amount of the Duty ; and if the Perfon receiving the Money does not figu the Receipt, and pay the Duty, he incurs the Penalty.

The Cafe was proved agreeable to Mr. Plumer's opening. by Barrowclough, confirmed by James Butler, who proved that the Defendant was paid (11, 155, 6d, for his Bill, and then afked to fign a Receipt, which was produced by Barrowclough, and to pay the Sum of 4d, which was the Price of the Stamp. The Defendant refused, and faid he fhould afk Advice of his Friends, and would fign it immediately after. Upon being frequently applied to afterwards, he perfevered in his Refutal to tign the Receipt, or pay the 4d.

Mr. Dauncey made a few Obfervations on Behalf of the Defendant.

When the Lord Chief Baron addreffed the Jury as follows :

I think this is an extremely proper Profecution. I take the Object of it to be to give Publicity to the Law. I entirely agree with what has fallen from the Counfel for the Crown, that the Receipt mult be given immediately upon the Payment of the Money, at the Peril of the Payty who refufes it.

By your Verdict I hope, therefore, it will be underftood, that the Law mult be put in Execution; and that a Perfon withholds a Receipt at the Time of receiving the Money at his Peril. It is impoffible that to a Butcher (a Man in confiderable Trade I fhould fuppole, by having a Bill of 11, 155. 6d. paid by a Cuftomer not of very high Rank), the 4d. fhould be an Object to him. I take it to be an Experiment on the Part of this Man, and perhaps many others, to try whether the Law can be evaded or not. It is not likely he fhould fquabble merely about 4d.; nor is it likely he fould fquabble merely about 4d.; nor is it likely he could have any Doubt about the Terms of the Receipt. It was extremely proper that it fhould be publified to the World, that a Man mult give a Receipt upon receiving out Money, and mult do it immediately. That I take to be the true Interpretation of the Law in this Cafe. Gentlemen, you can have no Doubt in finding a Verdict for the Crown.

The Jury immediately gave a Verdice for the King. Penalty. £ 10
