IS Majesty's Ship Druid arrived here early this Morning; and I have the Pleasure to inclose, for their Lordships' Information, Copy of a Letter, dated at Sea the 2d Instant, from Captain P. B. V. Broke, giving an Account of his having captured the French Ship Privateer Prince Murat, having on board Eighteen Six Pounders, and One Hundred and Twenty-seven Men; Five Days at Sea from L'Orient, and had not made any Captures.

I have the Honor to be, &c. GARDNER:

Druid, at Sea, February 2, 1806. My Lord, HAVE the Pleasure to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command captured this Morning, after a Chace of Ninety Miles, the Prince Murat French Ship Privateer, of Eighteen Guns, Six-Pounders, and One Hundred and Twenty. seven Men, commanded by Monsieur Rine Murin, out Five Days from L'Orient, and had made no Captures;—she is a coppered Ship, and a fast failer.
