THE King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honorable William Wyndham Baron Grenville; the Right Honorable Henry Petty, (commonly called Lord Henry Petty); John Charles Spencer, Esq; (commonly called Viscount Althorp); the Right Honorable William Wickham, and John Courtenay, Esq; to be Commissioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of His Majesty's Exchequer.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Right Honorable Henry Petty, (commonly called Lord Henry Petty,) the Offices of Chancellor and Under Treasurer of His Majesty's Exchequer.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honorable Charles Grey, Sir Philip Stephens, Bart. John Markham, Esq; Rear-Admiral of the White Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet, Sir Charles Morice Pole, Bart. Admiral of the Blue Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet, Sir Harry Neale, Bart. William Russell, Esq; (commonly called Lord William Russell,) and the Right Honorable William Lord Kenfington, of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, to be His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands, and Territories thereunto belonging.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honorable Gilbert Baron Minto, the Right Honorable George John Earl Spencer, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the Right Honorable William Windham, the Right Honorable Charles James Fox, His Majesty's Three Principal Secretaries of State; the Right Honorable William Wyndham Baron Grenville, First Commissioner of His Majesty's Treasury; the Right Honorable Henry Petty, (commonly called Lord Henry Petty,) Chancellor and Under Treasurer of His Majesty's Exchequer, the Right Honorable George Howard, (commonly called Viscount Morpeth,) the Right Honorable John Hiley Addington, and the Right Honorable John Sullivan, to be His Majesty's Commissioners for the Management of the Affairs of India.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Right Honorable Henry Earl of Carnarvon to be Master of the Horse to His Majesty.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral the Right Honorable Lord Gardner to William Marsden, Esq; dated on board His Majesty's Ship the Dryad, in Cork Harbour, February 5, 1806.

S I R,

HIS Majesty's Ship Druid arrived here early this Morning; and I have the Pleasure to inclose, for their Lordships' Information, Copy of a Letter, dated at Sea the 2d Instant, from Captain P. B. V. Broke, giving an Account of his having captured the French Ship Privateer Prince Murat, having on board Eighteen Six-Pounders, and One Hundred and Twenty-seven Men; Five Days at Sea from L'Orient, and had not made any Captures.

My LORD, Druid, at Sea, February 2, 1806.

I HAVE the Pleasure to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command captured this Morning, after a Chace of Ninety Miles, the Prince Murat French Ship Privateer, of Eighteen Guns, Six-Pounders, and One Hundred and Twenty-seven Men, commanded by Monsieur Rine Murin, out Five Days from L'Orient, and had made no Captures;—she is a coppered Ship, and a fast
