PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thoufand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit for His Majefty's Service flould be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould ou or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains, or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navý: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed by his faid Proclamation to declare, that all

able bodied Landmen not above the Age of Thirtyfive, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as afgrefaid, thould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thouland eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every able and ordi-nary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, flouid be paid to any Perfou who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him, or themfelves, fo that fuch Seam in or Seamen should be taken for His Majelly's Service by any of His Majelty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men. on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Procla mation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty first Day of December last: And whereas His Majefty was graciously pleafed by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of November last, to promife and declare that all able bodied Landmen fo entering themfelves to ferve in His Majelty's Royal Navy, on or before the faid Thirty first of December last should be entitled to receive the faid Bounty of Thirty Shillings each Man, upon Proof being exhibited that fuch able-bodied Landmen were not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years; and that a Reward of Three Pounds for every able Seaman and Fifty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships fhould be paid in the Manner directed hy His Majefty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and five, to any Perfon who should difcover fuch Seaman or Seamen respectively, who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen might be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December laft: And whereas by the faid above. recited Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November laft, His Majefty was further pleafed to promife and declare, that a Reward of Four Guineas for every able Seaman, Three Guineas for every ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman (hould be paid to any Perfon or Perfons who might, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December last, inclusive. procure the voluntary Service of, and convey fuch able Seaman or Landman fit for His Majesty's Service; on board any of His Majefty's Slups or Veffels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Mes, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each able Sea. man, ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile they might respectively travel to the nearest of His Majetty's Ships of War, or neareft Place of Refidence of any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, (provided fuch Man fhould be fit for His Majefty's Service, and there fhould not be Reason to suppose, that he was an Apprentice,) the faid Rewards and travelling Allow-ance, to be paid in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation: And whereas the Time li-

and travelling Allowance, has expired ; and it is expedient that the Payment thereof fince the Thirty-first of December last should be confirmed and approved, and that fuch Payment should be ftill further continued for fome Time longer, His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards and travelling Allowance made fince the Thirty-first Day of December last, be confirmed, and approved ; and that the like Payment he further made and continued from the Date hereof until the Thirty-firft Day of December next inclusive, whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefly, intituled "An Act for regulating the " Trade between the Subjects of His Majefty's Co-" lonies and Plantations in North America, and in " the Wefl India Iflands, and the Countries belong. ing to the United States of America, and between "His Majelly's faid Subjects and the Foreign "His Majelly's faid Subjects and the Foreign "Iflands in the Weft Indies;" it is, amongft other. Things, enacted, That it fhall and may be lawful for His Majefty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the lime being, to authorize, in Cale of Neceffity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock. from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United. States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, fhall not be imported, except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Reltrictions as shall be fpecified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majelly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and neceffary that Provision be made for fully fupplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, His Majefly doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Supply of the innabitants and Fintermen of the Ifland of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, may be imported into the faid Ifland from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in Britifh-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port mited for Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Inc.

land, or other His Majefty's Dominions in Europe's for which Purpofe a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Customs in England, or Scotland, or the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Perfon or Perfons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom, refpectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter-mentioned, which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which fuch; Licence is re fpectively granted; and no longer ; provided that no fach Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect :. And His Majefty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command, of any Ship or Vefiel to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Ifland of Newfoundland, where he shall difcharge fuch Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cultoms there, having first indorled on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Reafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned .: And the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms at Newfoundland, is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Mafter or Perfon having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel, of his having received the faid Licence fo indorfed as before-directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majelly's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Li-W. Fawkener. cence was granted.

Péafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock to some Port or Place in the Ifland of Newfoundland, and on the Arrival of the faid Ship at any Ports Harbour, or Place of Difcharge in Newfoundland, the Mafter or Perfon having the Charge or Command of the faid Ship, is required and enjoined tor deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or otherproper Officer of His Majefty's Cuftoms there, and to endorfe on the Back thereof the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number, of Live Stock, and thall thereupon receive a Certificate thereof from the faid Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms.
