## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Day His Grace John Duke of Bedford, the Right Honorable Henry Earl of Carnarvon, the Right Honorable John Jofhua Earl of Carysfort, the Right Honorable Charles Auguftus Lord Offnlfton, the Right Honorable St. Audrew Lord St. John, of Bletfoe, and the Right Honorable William Elliot, were, by His Majefty's Command, fworn of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council, and took their refpective Places at the Board accordingly.

• His Majefty, in Council, was this Day pleafed to declare His Grace John Duke of Bedford Lieutenant-General, and General Governor, of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

His Majefty having been gracioufly pleafed to deliver the Cuftody of the Seals of the Duchy and County-Palatine of Lancafter to the Right Honor able Edward Earl of Derby, the Oath of Chancellor of the faid Duchy was this Day, by His Majefty's Command, adminifered to his Lordfhip.

His Majefly having been pleafed, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, to conflitute the Right Honorable Francis Earl of Moira Conflable of His Majefly's Tower of London, and alfo Lord Lieuter ant of the Tower Hamlets, his Lordfhip this Day, in Council, took the Oaths appointed to be taken, inflead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy, as Conflable of the faid Tower, and as Lord Lieutenant of the faid Tower Hamlets, and likewife the Oath of Conflable of the Tower of London-

His Majefty, in Council, was this Day pleafed to appoint Henry Lee Warner, of Walfingham, Efq; to be Sheriff of the County of Norfolk, in the Room of John Morfe, of Mount Ida, Efq. :

And Le Gendre Pierce Starkie, of Huntroyd, Elq: to be Sheriff of the County-Falatine of Lancaster.

And His Majefty was also pleafed to make the following Amendment upon the Roll :

W HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thoufand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit for His Majefty's Service flould be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould ou or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains, or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navý: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed by his faid Proclamation to declare, that all
