## Warlaw, Fan. 25.

Nour laft we gave you an account of the meeting of the Dyet, fince which, nothing of Moment has paffed, but is is expected that in few days we shall hear of fome Matters of importance, and that it will be propoled, that the Kings eldeft Son may be Declared his Succeffor. which in all probability will meet with great opposition. The Molcovite Ambaflador is not yet arrived, nor have we any account when we may expect him; but in the mean time fome of the Senators have declared their opinion to be, That the Alliance which has been to long Treating between the Moscovites and this Crown be speedily concluded, for that there is ground enough to believe, that the Turks when they have their Armies in the Field, may, if they find this Kingdom unprovided, be cally induced to employ their Arms against it. The Marriage of the Prince of Brandenburg with the Princels Radzeville, is still difcourfed of as a thing that may be of great confequence to the Affairs of this Kingdom, because of the great Interest that Prince will have in Linbuanta, great part of which Dutchy he will now be possessed of in right of his Wife.

Dantzick, Fan. 31. From Moscovy they tell us, that the Czar will have very great Armies in the Field the next Summer, and they fpeak of no lefs than 300000 Men ; by which it does not feem that they have any thoughts of Peace, We have our Polith Letters, but they bring us nothing confiderable, none of the great Matters that have been difcourfed of, having as yet been moved in the Dyet.

Lisbonne, Fan. 6. We are expecting the arrival of the Marquis de Dronero, Amballador Extraordinary from the Duke of Savoy with fome impatience, for it is a long while fince we heard of his departure This being the Infanta's Birth-day, from Turin. when the entred into the thirtcenth year of her age, all the Forreign Ministers have been at Court to make their Compliments to the Prince Regent, the Queen, and the Infanta thereupon.

Genoua, Jan. 29. Yesterday arrived here the Dutch Convoy, which has been fo long expected, confifting of two men of War and four Merchantships, all bound for Smirna : they have been four Months in coming from Hollan1, and intend to part hence again in few days, and to call in at Leghorn. Naples, and Meff.na. Here are not any Englith Ships in Port.

Lintz, Jan. 28. The rigor of the Scalon has made the Emperor put off his Journey to Fienna, till the 15th of March; but in the mean time he has appointed Commiffioners who are to meet with fome of the Principal Men among the Hungarians, and to adjust with them feveral Matters concerning the meeting of the Dyet, for the preventing of Diforder and Confusion; The Emperor we are told, intends to go and perform his Devotions at old Oetingen in Bavaria; and its faid the Elector of Bavaria will meet his Imperial Majefty there, which gives an occasion of renewing the Difcourie concerning the Electors Marriage with the Arch-Dutchels the Emperors Daughter. Prince Louis the Duke of Neuburg's Son is to have a Regiment of those that are now going to be raifed. The Duke of Neuburg will flay here till the Emperor and Empress remove to Vienna. The Regiment of Count Palfi is ordered to march into the Empire, to reinforce the Garrifon of Philipsburg. The Emperor is fending Count Berka in quality of his Envoye Extraordinary to the King of Denmark.

Strasburg, Feb. 3. The Baron de Monclar is on his departure for France; he is at prefent employed in taking a Review of the Troops that are quartered in this Countrey, that he may be able to give the King a perfect Account of them. Upon the Reprefentations that have been made by Count Manf+ feldt the Emperors Minister at the French Court, the King has Declared, that he is willing to name Commissioners who may meet with those of the Emperor, to examine and adjust the Matters in difference; and the Emperor has agreed likewife to appoint Commissioners on his part ; we know not yet the place they are to meet ar, but its faid it will be Francfort of Augsburg. The French work on their new Fortifications with all possible diligence; we are told that Count Mansfelds among other things defired, that the faid Fortifications might be difcontinued, during the intended Conferences between the Imperial and French Commillioners, but that the French Ministers would not hear of that.

Hamburg, Feb. 5. The laft week palled through this place two Ambaffadors from the Czar of Mofs covy, they had with them a Train of about 70 Porfons, and are going to France to make fome Propos fals as is given out, concerning the effablishing a Trade between the French and the Molcovites. Our laft Letters from Stockholme are dated the 21 of the last Month, they tell us, that the Queen of Sweden was four Months gone with Child, to the great joy of that Court , and that Count Benry Horne was like to be called to an Account concerning his Conduct of the Livenian Army, with which during the late War he was ordered to march into Prujfia, to give the Elector of Brandenburg a Diverfion on that fide, which Exp. dition proved very unfuccefsful, and the blame it feens is laid upon him. The King of Denmark has given Otders for the fit-

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ting out a Squadron of 16 men of War, which he intends to keep at Sea all the next Summer; and is likewife increasing his Land-Forces.

Cologne, Feb. 9. From Lorrain we have Advice, that two or three Batallions of the French Guards had received Orders to march to Verdun, to work on the new Fortifications that are making there, which they fay will render that place impregnable. Commiffioners are to meet on the part of the Emperor and the French King, to Regulate the Matter of the Dependencies, which has given fo great vexation to many Princes of the Empire; but at the fame time the French, intend to go on with their new Fortifications in Allace, though Count Mansfeldt, the Emperors Envoye at Paris has very much prefied that they might be difcontinued during the Conferences.

Amferdam, Feb. 11. On Friday laft in the afternoon the Prince and Princes of Orange, accompanied with a great many perfons of quality, arrived here from the Hague, being received by a Company of Burghers in Arms, who were drawn up at the Gate their Highneffes entred the Town at, and being Saluted with a difcharge of the Great Guns; that Evening their Highneffes went to fee the Lalian Opera; and the next day were very magnificently Entertained at the Stadthouse by the Magiltrates, in the name of the City; a Company of Burghers being appointed to keep a Guard before the Gates of the Stadthouse, during their Highneffes being there, who on Sunday after having b. en at Church, returned to the Hague.

Hague, Feb. 11. The Prince and Princess of Orange returned from Amsterdam luft. Sunday, extreamly fatisfied with their Entertainment here, which was most extraordinary. The States of Holland are to meet to morrow, and its faid that the chief buy finess that will employ them this Session, will be the fetling the flate of the Army, and the regulating the Affairs of the Revenue. The Heer Dieft, Envoye Extraordinary from the Elector of Brandenburgb will have his Audience of the States-General in a day or two. From Copenbagen they write that the King of Denmark was Arming by Sea and Land.

Bruffels, Feb. 11. The States of Brabant continue fill Assembled; the conclusion of the business of the Imposts being retarded by some new difficulties ariien in that Matter at Louvain and Antwerp, wh ch we doubt not but will be quickly removed. The great Reform will be Declared in a day or two, his Highnels having received the necessary Orders from Spain, concerning the Spanish Regiments, which are as well as the reft to be fubject to the faid Reform. Don Antonio d'Agurto is gone for Flandere to Command the Troops there. Don Bernardo de Salinas is preparing for his Journey to Germany, having received his Dispatches. The Letters we receive from Paris fay, that the differences between the French King and the Pope, feemed to be very far from an Accommodation, but rather to increase ; and that the Jesuits were in a great perplexity what to do in the cafe of Father Mainbourg, whom they had received a politive Order from the Pope to expel their Society; the fame Letters add, that the French were drawing a Body of 16 or 48000 Men .on the Frontiers of Savoy, and that it was believed their eye was upon Cazalu

Marfeilles, Feb. 1. The laft week departed from hence a Ship of this place for Argiers, Awhich carried an Envoy from the King, and another from the Commerce of this place, to demand fatisfaction for feveral abufes committed of late by those Pyrats; as the taking Paffengers and Strangers Goods out of French Veifels; the making Slaves of fuch French men as they have found in forreign Veifels, harboring those of Sally, and granting private Commissions to them: for all which the King demands fatisfaction; or otherwise threatens to Declare a War; this Veifel had frict Orders not to carry any Goods thither, nor to bring any from thence.

,' Plymouth, Feb. 4. This morning arrived here His Majeflies Ship the Leopard, Capt. Story Commander, who came from Cadiz with 26 Merchant Ships under his Convoy, which are paft up the Channel.
