PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the "Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Co-" lonies and Plantations in North America, and in " the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between "His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign "Islands in the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorize, in Case of Necessity, the Importation into Newsoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then enfining Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in Conformity to such tRules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders. Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision the made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Prvy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects; and in British built Ships, owned by His Wajesty's Subjects,

T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 1st of | and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe; for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted. by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England, or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His-Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom, respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster-mentioned, which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Coro, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Cultoms there, having first indorfed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned: And the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland, is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Maller or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence to indorfed as before-directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, of to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.
