His Majefly's Gun-Brig Forward, SIR, at Sea, Eebruary 7, 1806. I BEG Leave to inform you, that, at Three A. M. . Dunnofe bearing N. E. by E. Sixor Seven Leagues, we fell in with a French Lugger Privateer, which after a Chace of Half an Hour, and a short Firing, we captured. She proves to be the La Rancune, of Cherbourg, Captain Foliot; out of Cherbourg Twelve Hours, but had taken nothing. She is pierced for Twelve Guns, had only Four mounted, with Swivels and fmall Arms. Two of the Enemy are wounded, one dangeroufly.
