SIR,

I BEG Leave to inform you, that, at Three A. M. Dunnofe bearing N. E. by E. Six or Seven Leagues, we fell in with a French Lugger Privateer, which after a Chace of Half an Hour, and a short Firing, we captured. She proves to be the La Rancune, of Cherbourg, Captain Foliot; out of Cherbourg Twelve Hours, but had taken nothing. She is pierced for Twelve Guns, had only Four mounted, with Swivels and small Arms. Two of the Enemy are wounded, one dangerously.
