*W*hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Lieutenant George Rutherford stands charged with the Murder of Three of the Seamen of His Majesty's Ship the Trident, at Butler Island, near Bombay, in the East Indies, on the 31st of March and 1st of April 1801, which said Three Seamen are stated to have died through excessive Punishment inflicted on them by order of the said Lieutenant George Rutherford, then Acting Captain of the said Ship Trident; and whereas the said Lieutenant George Rutherford, did, on the Evening of Wednesday the 12th Day of March instant, jump overboard from His Majesty's Ship the Salvadore del Mundo, lying at Plymouth, and is supposed to have effected his Escape;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the said Lieutenant George Rutherford, is hereby pleased to require and command all His loving Subjects to discover and apprehend the said Lieutenant George Rutherford, and to carry him before some of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate of the County, Town, or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and

to give Notice thereof to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forthcoming and may be dealt withal and proceeded against according to Law.

And, as a further Encouragement His Majesty is hereby pleased to offer a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person who shall discover and apprehend the said Lieutenant George Rutherford, to be paid by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury. SPENCER.
