

the said George Rutherford (who is about Forty Years of Age, is upwards of Five Feet Ten Inches High, of a dark swarthy Complexion, slender Person, but well made, and of a long thin Face, with dark Eyebrows and Black Eyes) to be discovered and apprehended, and to convey him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or the Chief Magistrate of the County, City, Town, or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End that the said George Rutherford may be forthcoming, and be proceeded against according to Law; and whoever shall discover the said George Rutherford, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, shall receive for Reward the Sum of THREE HUNDRED POUNDS; which said Sum of Three Hundred Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and six, in the Forty-sixth Year of Our Reign.
