YESTERDAY at Noon, Barbadoes bearing South 72 Deg. West, distant Fifty-six Miles, Two strange Sail were seen to Windward, steering large. We soon discovered one of them to be His

Majesty's Ship *Heureux*, in chace of an Enemy's Schooner. Being to Leeward, I was happy in having it in my Power to assist the *Heureux*, by preventing the Chace getting before the Wind, though she endeavoured to cross us. The *Agamemnon* gained very fast on her to Leeward, as did the *Heureux* to Windward. Both Ships got alongside of her at half past Seven P.M. when the *Heureux* took Possession. She proves to be the *Dame Ernouf*, of Sixteen long Sixes (thrown overboard in the Chace) and One Twelve-Pounder, with a Complement of One Hundred and Fifteen Men; had been out Fourteen Days from Guadeloupe, without making any Capture.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses without Payment of Duty:" It is, amongst other Things, enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees of any of the Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated or described in the Tables hereunto annexed, marked (D), and which shall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in such Warehouse or Warehouses as may be fit and proper for the Reception and safe Custody of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, without Payment, at the Time of the first Entry, of the Duties of Customs due on the Importation thereof; provided it shall be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England, or any



Four or more of them, that such Warehouses are in every Respect proper for the securing such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, without Risk to the Revenue; and provided also that the Importer, Proprietor, or Consignee of any such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, shall enter into Bond to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, with One sufficient Surety, to be approved of by the Collector and Comptroller of the Port of London, in double the Amount of the Duties of the Customs due and payable on the Importation of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and with such Conditions as are, by this Act, required with respect to the Bonds to be given for the Duties on the Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated in Table (C).

“Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Goods, Wares, and Merchandize enumerated and described in the said Table marked (D), shall be subject and liable to all the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions required by this Act with respect to Goods, Wares, and Merchandize secured in Warehouses under the Authority thereof.”

And whereas, by the Ninth Section of the said Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows: “That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty’s Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then, and from thenceforth, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend, to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every Respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act.”

We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty’s Treasury, pursuant to, and in Execution of the Powers vested in us in and by the said Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Hides legally imported or brought into the Port of London, (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indies,) and that such Hides may be lodged and secured under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in such Warehouse or Warehouses as may be fit and proper for the Reception and safe Custody of the Goods hereinbefore described, and remain therein, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and we further declare, that, from and after the Publication of this our said Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend, and be construed to extend, to all such Hides, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (D) annexed to the said Act at the Time of passing thereof.
