MY LORD, *Active, at Sea, April 27, 1806.*

I DO myself the Honor to acquaint your Lord-
ship, that His Majesty's Ship under my Com-
mand, has this Day captured the French Schooner
Les Amis, a Letter of Marque of Four Six-Poun-
ders, and Twenty Men, belonging to Cayenne, and
bound thither with a Cargo of Wine and various
Merchandize from Bourdeaux.
