His Majefly, for the better Diforery and bringing, to Jufflice the Perfons concerned in this Felony and Murders is bereby pleafed to promise His most gracious

Pardon' to any One of more of the faid Offenders (.except. the Mafters or Commanders on board of the faid Lug-gers, and the Perfons who adjually fired,) who fball: diffeover his or their Accomplices therein, fo that any is one or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the faid Offence.
