HE King has been pleased to cause it to be fignified by the Right Honorable Charles James Fox, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Assairs, to the Ministers of Friendly-and Neutral Powers residing at this Court, that, in consequence of subsequent Advices, the Blockade announced to the said Ministers on the 8th of April last shall not extend to the River Trave.

A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21st of May 1806,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty first Day of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inslicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An" "Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the

"Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Marms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coasswife of Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

His Majefly's Ship Pallas, St. Martin's-SIR, Road, Isle Ree, May 10, 1806. HE French Trade having been kept in Port of SIR,

late, in a great Measure by their Knowledge of the exact Situation of His Majesty's Cruizers, constantly announced at the Signal Posts, it appeared to me to be some Object, as there was nothing better in view, to endeavour to stop this Practice. Ports, the Whole were then discharged, the Effect Accordingly the Two Posts at La Pointe de la Roche and Crash was dreadful; their Decks were deserted, were demolished; next that of Caliola; then Two in L'Ance de Repos, one of which Lieutenant Halwell and Mr. Hillier, the Gunner, took in a neat Style from upwards of One Hundred Militia.

The Marines and Boats' Crews behaved exceedingly well; all the Flags have been brought off, and the Houses built by Government burnt to the

Yesterday too, the Zeal of Lieutenant Norton, of the Frisk Cutter, and Lieutenant Gregory, of the Contest Gun Brig, induced them to volunteer to flank the Battery on Point d'Equillon, while we should attack it by Land in the Rear, but it was carried at once; and one of Fifty Men, who were stationed to the Three Thirty-us-Pounders, was made Prisoner, the rest escaped. The Battery is laid in ruins; Guns spiked, Carriages burnt, Barrack and Magazine blown up, and all the Shells thrown into the Sea. The Signal Post of L'Equillon, together with the House, shared the Fate of the Gun Carriages; the Convoy got into a River beyond our Reach.

Lieutenant Mappleton, Mr. Sutherland the Mafter, and Mr. Hillier, were with me, who, as they do on all Occasions, so they did at this Time whatever was in their Power for His Majesty's Service.

The Petty Officers, Seamen, and Marines failed not to justify the Opinion that there was before Reafon to form; yet it would be inexcusable were not the Names of the Quarter-Masters, Barden and Casey, particularly mentioned, as Men highly deferving any Favour that can be shewn in the Line to which they aspire.

His Majefly's Ship Pallas, 14th May, off the Island of Oleron. SIR.

HIŞ Morning when close to L'Isse d'Aix, reconnoitring the French Squadron, it gave me reat Joy to find our late Opponent, the Black Frigate, and her Companions the Three Brigs, getting under Sail; we formed high Expectation, that the long wished for Opportunity was at last arrived.

The Pallas remained under Topfails by the Wind to await them; at Half past Eleven a smart Pointblank Firing commenced on both Sides, which was feverely felt by the Enemy. The Main-top-fail Yard of one of the Brigs was cut through, and the Frigate lost her After-Sails. The Batteries on L'Isle D'Aix opened on the Pallas, and a Cannonade continued, interrupted on our Part only by the Necessity we were under to make various Tacks to avoid the Shoals, till One o'Clock, when our Endeavour to gain-the Wind of the Enemy, and get between him and the Batteries proved successful; an effectual Distance was now chosen-a few Broadsides were poured in—the Enemy's Fire flackened;—I ordered our's to cease; and directed Mr. Sutherland, the Master, to run the Frigate on board, with Intention effectually to prevent her Retreat by boarding.

The Enemy's Side thruit our Guns back into the

and Crash was dreadful; their Decks were deserted, Three Pistol Shots were the unequal Return.

With confidence I lay, that the Frigate was lost to France, had not the unequal Collision tore away our Fore-Topmast, Jib-Boom, Fore and Main-Top-sail Yards, Spritsail Yard, Bumpkin, Cathead, Chainplates, Fore-Rigging, Forefail, and Bower Anchor. with which last I intended to hook on, but all proved insufficient. She was yet lost to France, had not the French Admiral, seeing his Frigate's Fore-Yard gone, her Rigging ruined, and the Danger the was in, fent Two others to her Affistance.

The Pallas being a Wreck, we came out with what little Sail could be fet, and His Majesty's Sloop the Kingsfisher afterwards took us in tow.

The Officers and Ship's Company behaved as usual; to the Names of Lieutenants Haswell and Mappleton, whom I have mentioned on other Occafions, I have to add that of Lieutenant Robins, who has just joined.

Copy of a Letter from Piettro Marincouichi, Commander of the Envy Privateer, to William Marfden, Efq; dated Gibraltar, April 12, 1806.

SIR;

BEG Leave to inform you, that being on a Cruize off Cape de Gatt, on the 11th February last, I fell in with and captured His Catholic Majefty's Gun Boat No. 4. called the Peculo, com-manded by Don Antonio Garcea Novarro, mounting One Eighteen Pounder and Four Brass Four-Pounders; the Commander and Master, with Three Seamen, were killed during the Action.

Whitehall, May 31, 1806. W Hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Night of the 23d Inflant, a Sixoared Boat, belonging to the Stag Cutter, in the Service of His Majefly's Customs, endeavoured to board a Smug-gl.ng Lugger, off the Town of Deal; and that on her approaching the faid Lugger the Crew of the lutter fired feveral Muskets at the faid Boat, whereby James Russell and Robert Barham were wounded, and the faid James Russell has since died of his Wounds; that the Grew of the said Lugger immediately hoisted her Forefail, and run her on Shore, keeping up a continual Fire on the faid Boat's Crew, and that there were at the fame Time approaching the Shore Nine Luggers of different Sizes, Four of them very large, and between Two Hundred and Three Hundred Men on the Shore, mostly armed, running Goods from the faid Luggers into the Town; that the faid Boat's Crew being obliged, by the Roughness of the Sea, to land, were fur rounded by the Smugglers, and kicked and beaten very feverely, their Arms taken from them, and the Boat flowe to Pieces, and her Mast, Sails, Arms, and Oars, taken away; and that among the faid Laugers were the Fly, of Folkstone's the Nancy, of Lydd; the Jo, Vistory, Hawke, and



Betfey, of Deal, from the latter of which the faid Shots

are supposed to have been fired.
