

Vessels employed in the Southern Whale Fishery from carrying on the same, in such and the same Manner as might have been done if this Order had not been made.

And it is also His Majesty's Pleasure, That no Arms or Artillery, Gunpowder or Ammunition of any Sort, be allowed to be imported into the said Settlement, or the Territories or Dependencies thereof, except by the said United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, or by Licence from His Majesty.

And it is His Majesty's further Pleasure, That the Trade and Commerce to and from the said Settlement, and the Territories and Dependencies thereof, shall be subject to such of the Laws of Trade and Navigation as would have affected the same if this Order had not been made, except so far as such Laws are contrary to this present Order:—

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty during the present War and until the 6th Day of April next after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace further additional Rates and Duties in Great Britain on the Rates and Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades and Offices; and for repealing an Act passed in the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for repealing certain Parts of an Act made in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty, for granting a Contribution on the Profits arising from Property, Professions, Trades, and Offices: and to consolidate and render more effectual the Provisions for collecting the said Duties.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the 29th Day of September, 1806, certain Duties on the Importation, and to allow certain Drawbacks and Bounties on the Exportation of certain Sorts of Iron, Sugar, and Tea, into and from Ireland.

An Act to repeal the several Duties under the Care of the Commissioners for managing the Duties upon Stamped Vellum, Parchment, and Paper in Ireland, and to grant new and additional Duties in lieu thereof, and to amend the Laws relating to the Stamp Duties in Ireland.

An Act to repeal several Acts passed in the Forty-third and Forty-fourth Years of His present Majesty for raising and establishing an additional Force in Ireland for the Defence of the Realm.

An Act for the more easy and speedy Recovery of small Debts within the Isle of Wight, in the County of Southampton.

An Act for better paving, lighting, cleansing, watching, and otherwise improving the City of Norwich.

An Act for enlarging the Powers of an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty for rebuilding the Tower of the Parish Church of Saint Peter, in the Borough and Liberty of St. Alban, in the County of Hertford, together with the Chancel thereof, and for more effectually repairing the said Parish Church.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Road from Dunchurch to Hillmorton, in the County of Warwick, and from thence to Saint James's End, in the Parish of Dulton, in the County of Northampton.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Roads from the North West Parts of the County of Lincoln, through Nettleham Fields, Wragby Lane, and Baumber Fields, to the North East Part of the said County, and other Roads therein described, in the said County.

An Act for altering, amending, and consolidating several Acts, so far as the same relate to the Road from Renfrew to Greenock, and from Kilbarchan to Inchinnan Bridge, in the County of Renfrew.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Collingwood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to William Marsden, Esq; dated on board the Ocean, off Cadix; the 15th of May 1806.

SIR,

ENCLOSE, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Copy of a Letter which I have this Day received from Captain Hillyar, of His Majesty's Ship Niger, giving an Account of his having captured, on the 2d Instant, His Catholic Majesty's Schooner El Virgin del Carmen, bound with Dispatches from Algeiras to La Guira.

MY LORD, *Niger, at Sea, May 2, 1806.*

I HAVE the Honor to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command this Day captured the Spanish (Government) Schooner El Virgin del Carmen, commanded by Lieutenant Luis Navaretta, from Algeiras bound to La Guira, with Dispatches, which were thrown overboard in the Chace. She is coppered, and pierced for Twelve Guns, but at present has only Four Swivels on board; and a Proportion of small Arms for her Crew, consisting of Twenty-one Men.
