Exchequer Bill Office, July 8, 1806.

All Exchequer-Bills dated in the Month of August 1805,

TO BE PAID OFF.

THE Lord's Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having given Directions for paying off the Principal of the above mentioned Exchequer Bills with the Interest thereon, at the Exchequer Bill-Office, in the Receipt of Exchequer, New Palace Yard, Westminster, on Thursday the 31st Day of July 1806, Attendance will be given daily (Sundays and Holidays excepted) until Thursday the 24th Instant inclusive, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning till One in the Afternoon, for the Purpose of receiving the same. And for the greater Dispatch, the Bearers of the said Bills are desired to bring separate Lists of each Description of Bills, containing the Numbers in Numerical Order, according to the Value of the said Bills, and Times of Commencement of Interest, with the Principal Sums and Interest due thereon, computed from the Days on which they are respectively dated, exclusive to the said 31st Day of July 1806, inclusive, when the Interest will cease; and they are desired to write their Names and Places of Abode on such Lists, and indorse their Names on the said Bills.

If any of the Holders of the aforesaid Bills should be desirous of receiving Payment of the Principal and Interest, previous to the said 31st Day of July, they may be accommodated on computing the Interest to the Day on which they wish to be paid, and leaving the said Bills for Examination One Day prior thereto.

Such Persons as may be desirous of having New Exchequer Bills in Part Payment, upon mentioning the Amount at the Bottom of their Lists delivered on or before the 24th Instant, may be accommodated with New Bills carrying an Interest of Three Pence Halfpenny by the Day on every One Hundred Pounds, which said New Bills will bear Date the said 31st Day of July 1806, and will be delivered on Saturday the 2d August, and the following Days.

Upon every Piece of Paper, &c. on which the aggregate Amount of any Valuation or Appraisement of any Estate, Property, or Effects, Real or Personal, or of any Interest in Possession or Reversion, Remainder or Contingency, in any Estate or Property, Real or Personal, shall be written or set down, where the Amount shall not exceed 50*l.*

N. B. All Persons, valuing Property for or in Expectation of FIRE OR REWARD, are to be deemed Appraisers, and are to take out Annual Licences, upon pain of forfeiting for every Offence the Sum of

The Licences issued between the 5th July and 5th August, are to bear Date on the 6th July; and such as are granted at any other Time, are to be dated the Day on which the same shall be issued, and they are respectively to continue in force until the ensuing 5th July.

Persons duly licensed AS AUCTIONEERS are not required to take out Licences as Appraisers

Every Appraiser is to write or set down, in Words or Figures, the full Amount of every Valuation or Appraisement, and, WITHIN FOURTEEN DAYS, to deliver the same to his Employer, on Paper, &c. DULY STAMPED, on pain of forfeiting for every Neglect, or for delivering the same not duly stamped, the Sum of
