THE Royal College of Physicians, in London, having received Accounts from various Parts of England, complaining of the number of irregular Practitioners, calling themselves Physicians, who exercise the Profession of Physic without Authority, and in many Instances without due Qualification; feel it their Duty to apprise the Public of the legal Provisions to obviate this Evil, and to refer them to the List annually printed by the College, (which in future they will take Care to have properly circulated,) in order that the Names of all those may be known who, having been examined by the College according to Law, have been deemed competent to practise as Physicians.

Extract from the Acts of Parliament 14th and 15th of Hen. VIII.:

"That it may be enacted in this present Parliament, that no Person from henceforth be suffered to exercise or practise in Physic through England, untill such Time that he be examined at London by the said President and Three of the said Elects, and have from the said President and Elects Letteis testimonial of their approving and Examination, except he be a Graduate of Oxford or Cambridge, which hath accomplished all Things for his Form, without any Grace."

Saturday the 19th Day of July, in the Forty sixth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, One thousand eight hundred and Six, between John Taylor, Plaintiff, Robert Brears, Defendant.

UPON the humble Petition of the Plaintiff, this Day preferred unto the Right Honorable the Master of the Rolls, for the Reasons therein contained, and upon reading the Six Clerks' Certificate, and an Office Copy of the Affidavit of the Plaintiff, his Honor doth order, that the Defendant do appear to the Plaintiff's Bill on or before the 1st Day of September next.

WHEREAS by an Order of the High Court of Chancery made in a Cause in which Joseph Wheatley and others are Plaintiffs, and Thomas Buxton, Defendant, it was referred to John Springett Harvey, Esq; one of the Masters of the said Court, to inquire and state to the Court, who was or were the next of Kin of Timothy Bentley, Esq; (who died in February 1805, at Leicester, where he had resided many Years,) at the Time of his Death, and in case any of them have since died, who is or are the personal Representative or Representatives of him, her, or them so dying.
