Bills of Health; and that if any Perfon whatfoever, after fuch Notification or Publication of any fuch Order or Orders in Council, fhall prefume, under any Pretence whatfoever; to go with any Ship, Boat, or Veffel within the Limits of any fuch Station, he or fhe fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds.

And whereas by His Majelty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thoufand eight hundred and five, it is directed that all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of Commiffioned Officers of His Majefty's Navy, coming from any of the Places mentioned in the faid Grder, and not being provided with clean Bills of Health, shall perform Quarantine at the Motherbauk, in a feparate and diffinet Place, to be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys for that Purpole; which Place has been appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly. His Majefty, in Purfuance of the Powers wefted

His Majefty, in Purfuance of the Powers vefted in him by the faid Act, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Perfons, Ships, Veffels, or Boats whatfoever, other than the Veffels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Affittant, or other Boats regularly employed, under the Authority of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, in the Quarantine Service, fhall go, under any Pretence whatfoever, within the Limits of the Place fo marked out, except in Cafes of fpecial Neceffity and Emergency, and with Permiffion firlt had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Affittant.

And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Veffels being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the fame at the Motherbank, shall come to Anchor within the Compass of the faid Yellow. Buoys, in fuch Place, or Places, as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Affiltant, and shall be kept feparate and apart from His Majefty's Ships of War, Transports, and Veffels in the Service of Government, and not having Clean Bills of Health, which may be performing Quarantine as aforefaid, within the Compass of the faid Yellow Buoys:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of this Majefty's 'Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

or to any Member, Creek, or Place belonging to, or within any or either of the above Ports, fhall no longer perform Quarantine at Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth, but fhall perform the fame at Inverkeithing Bay; and that fuch Ships or Veffels as are bound to the South Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of

or to any Member, Creek, or other Place belonging to, or within either of thole Ports, fhall no longer perform their Quarantine at Carfthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith, but fhall perform the fame at Holy Loch, in the Firth of Clyde :--And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceflary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
