

Bills of Health; and that if any Person whatsoever, after such Notification or Publication of any such Order or Orders in Council, shall presume, under any Pretence whatsoever, to go with any Ship, Boat, or Vessel within the Limits of any such Station, he or she shall, for every such Offence, forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds.

And whereas by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, it is directed that all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of Commissioned Officers of His Majesty's Navy, coming from any of the Places mentioned in the said Order, and not being provided with clean Bills of Health, shall perform Quarantine at the Motherbank, in a separate and distinct Place, to be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys for that Purpose; which Place has been appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly.

His Majesty, in Pursuance of the Powers vested in him by the said Act, is pleased, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Persons, Ships, Vessels, or Boats whatsoever, other than the Vessels or Boats belonging to the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his Assistant, or other Boats regularly employed, under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in the Quarantine Service, shall go, under any Pretence whatsoever, within the Limits of the Place so marked out, except in Cases of special Necessity and Emergency, and with Permission first had and obtained from the Superintendent of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Assistant.

And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Vessels being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the same at the Motherbank, shall come to Anchor within the Compass of the said Yellow Buoys, in such Place, or Places, as shall be directed by the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his Assistant, and shall be kept separate and apart from His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having Clean Bills of Health, which may be performing Quarantine as aforesaid, within the Compass of the said Yellow Buoys:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.
WHEREAS the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Scotland, have been authorized to cause a Land Lazaretto to be erected at Holy Loch, in the River Clyde, on the Western Coast of Scotland, and another at or near Inverkeithing Bay on the Eastern Coast, for the Reception and airing of Goods, subject to the Rules of Quarantine: And whereas it has been represented by the said Commissioners, that the Resort of Ships liable to Quarantine, bound to the Northern Ports

of Scotland, or to the South-West Ports thereof is very inconsiderable, and that it may be expedient that so much of His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, as relates to the Performance of Quarantine at Cromarty Bay, and at Carlhorn, should be revoked; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all such Ships or Vessels liable to the Performance of Quarantine as are bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of

Inverness,
Zetland,
Orkney,
Caithness, and
Stornaway,

or to any Member, Creek, or Place belonging to, or within any or either of the above Ports, shall no longer perform Quarantine at Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth, but shall perform the same at Inverkeithing Bay; and that such Ships or Vessels as are bound to the South West Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of

Kirkcudbright,

or to any Member, Creek, or other Place belonging to, or within either of those Ports, shall no longer perform their Quarantine at Carlhorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith, but shall perform the same at Holy Loch, in the Firth of Clyde:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
