*Brussels, March 7.* The march of the French Troops, who are ordered to enter into the Country of *Luxemburg*, will we hope be prevented by the Orders our Governour the Prince of *Parma* has sent for the delivering *Virtun* up to them. The *Sieur Christin* is gone for *Courtray* to renew the Conferences there with the French Commissioners; which we wish may have better success then they have as yet had. His Highness intends to go for *Antwerp* the next week, and from thence to *Ghent*, and we are told that he will be abroad near two Months. His Highness is sending the Count of *Trada* for *England*, who will part from hence in few days. Last night arriv'd here from *England* Signior *Sarozzi* late President at that Court from the Republick of *Venice*.

*Flague, March 7.* The City of *Amsterdam* not approving of the new Project concerning the Customs, the Pensioner *Fagel* and the Baron *d'Asperen*, are appointed to go thither to endeavor to adjust the matter. The Prince of *Orange* is diverting himself with Hunting in the *Veluwe*, with the *Sir ur Van Leeuwen* who returned some-days sine from his Embassy in *England*, is gone to wait upon his Highness, who will be back here on Monday next. It is reported that the *Brandenburg* Frigats, which some time sine took the Spanish Ship in the Road of *Ostend*, are gone for the *West-Indies*, though we cannot think that they were victualled for so long a Voyage. The Duke of *Zell*, the Duke of *Hanover*, who returns from *Venice*, and the Prince his Son, who is now in *England*, intend to be on the fifth of *April* at *Hummelingen* in the County of *Linghen*, whither the Prince of *Orange* has invited them and some other Princes of the Empire to Hunt; they will continue in those parts about three weeks or a Month, and come thither about the beginning of *May*.

*Hague, March 7.* The States have directed the several Admiralties to send their Deputies hither to consult with those of the State, in order to the finding out an effectual means for the obliging all Ships which come from places infected to perform a Quarantine. There is some difference between *Amsterdam*, and the other Towns of this Province about the alterations which the States of *Holland* would make in the Duties upon several Commodities brought into this Country, which endeavors are using to adjust.

*Paris, March 8.* We are informed that the King has sent Orders to several Troops to march to *Luxemburg*, to possess themselves of *Virtun*, and in case any opposition be made by the Spaniards, to quarter upon the Country; The English and Dutch Ministers at this Court are said to have employed their Offices to prevent the execution of these Orders. The 5th Instant the Baron, *de Furstemberg* Envoye from the Bishop of *Murster* had his first Audience of the King.

*Plymouth, Feb. 25.* On Tuesday last His Majesties Ship the *Swallow*, the *Pearle*, the *Guernsey*, and the *Orange-Tree*, sailed from hence to their former station to Cruise. Yesterday morning the *Faulcon*,

and the *Phoenix* Frigats Sailed from hence for the Downs.

*Chester, Feb. 26.* On Sunday last the *Goodspeed* of *Leverpole*, John Smith Master, coming from *Lubbin*, unhappily ran aground between the *Red-Stones* and *Black-Rock*; and there was split in pieces; It's reported there were above 60 Passengers on Board her, of which not above three or four were saved.

*Deale, Feb. 28.* This morning the *Oxford* Frigate, on Board of which is the Lord *Sandwich* His Majesties Ambassador to the Grand Signior, sailed out of the Downs with 16 Merchant Ships under her Convoy.

*Whitehal, March 2.* This day Mr. *Edward Fitzharris*, Son to Sir *Edward Fitzharris*, Papist, having been examined before His Majesty in Council, as to the Matters he is charged with, by Sir *William Waller*, Mr. *Everard*, and Mr. *Smith*, was ordered to be removed from the *Gaolhouse*, where he lay committed since Monday last, to *Newgate*, for High-Treason, in Imagining, Devising, and Compassing the Deposing, and Killing of the King, in order to his Tryal.

*White hal. March 2.* This morning about nine a clock dyed at *St. James's* the Lady *Isabelle*, youngest Daughter to his Royal Highness, after three or four days Sickness, to the grief of their Majesties and the whole Court.
