Extrat of a Letter from Major-General Beresford to the Right Hoxorable Lord Caflereagh, dated Fort of Buenos Ajres, 1 ith guiy 5806 .

ITRUST the Conduct adopted towards the Peo: ple here has had its full Effect, in imprefing upon their Minds the Honor, Generofty, and Hamanity of the Britifh Character His Maje!ty's Minifters will fee by the Detail of our Proceedings that, afier the Army had paffied the Rio Chuelo, the City of Buenos Ayres remained at our Mercy, and that, in fact, the only Conditions on which I eutered were fuch as I pleafed to offer, and which Humanity amd a Regard to our national CharaCier would naturally induce me to give under any Círcumiltances. However, to quiet the Minds of the Intrabitants, wie not only confented to put in Writing iny Promifes, but acceded to many Conditions not expected by them : and, contrary to direct Stipulation, gave up to the Proprietors all the Cosalling Veflels eapured, with their Cargoes, and of which I aniex a Rcturn*, and the Value of which amounted to One Million and a Half of Dollars, and, which being dons with the Views already' expofed, will, I truft, meet with His Majeity's Approbation.

1 have the Honor to inform His Majefty's Miaifters, that I had detached Captain Arbuthnot of the 20th Light Dragoons, on the $3^{d}$ Inftant, with a Party confifting of feven. Dragoons, and Twenty Infantry, (the whole monnted) to a Place called Luxan, Fifty Miles diftant. My principal Object was to have the Country reconnoitred, and to fee what were the Difpofitions of the Inbabitants; but with the avowed Object of efcorting back fome of the 'lreafure which had been taken from here, and to prevent its following the Viceroy, which i had Reafon to fufpect was iutended, though it was faid to be all private Property; and, in which cafe, we had declared, if brought back, it thould be given to Its Owners, if of this City.-Captain Arbuthnot ieturned laft Night; and I am glad to fay with Information of a pleating Nature; for your Lordhip will fee, by this Detachmenc paffing fo eafily through the Country, that whatever their prefent Inclimations may be, there is uo very great Danger from any holtile Intentions againt us': and Captain Arbuthot reports "ather favourably of the general Difpofitions of the People. The Cuuntry to Laxan, as Ihave already reprefented; in general the whole of it, is a perfect Flat, and the View of the Horizon obltructed by aothing but the iminenfe Herds of Horfes and Cattle - but principally horind Cattle.
Luxan is fituated on a River of the fame Name, and where there is a bridge over it, and the Route leading to all the interior Provinces, and I rather think it: will be adivifeable on many Accounts that [ poflefs myfelf of it, which I can do by a friall Detachment. Much of the Treafore was caught actually going to Cordova, and the Rett, but for the op-
