WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and five, to direct that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order of the same Date upon all Ships and Vessels, as well His Majesty's Ships of War as all others, not having the Plague or other infectious Disease or Distemper actually on board, coming from or through the Mediterranean, with Clean Bills of Health, should be extended to all Ships and Vessels as aforesaid coming from the Port of Cadiz, or from any other Port of Spain without the Streights of Gibraltar, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent: And whereas there does not at present appear to be any Reason to apprehend that there does exist any unusual or infectious Distemper in any Part of Spain; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and discharge, and doth hereby revoke and discharge the said Order of the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and five; and His Majesty doth hereby order, that all such Ships and Vessels as aforesaid be permitted to discharge their respective Lading without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and five, had not been made; any Thing in the said Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The like Account is required from all Officers on the Half-Pay of the Land Forces, whether desirous of engaging in the present Service or not.
