AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 19th of November 1806,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-first Day of May last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of December next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of December next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the

Whitehall, November 25, 1806.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that on Wednesday the 12th Instant, about Eight

o'Clock in the Evening, the House of Mrs. Margaret Baldwin, of Broadfield, near Plaxtol, in Kent, was attacked by Eight or Ten Men, with White Veils over their Faces, who, after having secured the Servants by Threats and Fire-Arms, compelled Mrs. Baldwin, who is about Eighty-seven Years of Age, to open all her Bureaus and Closets above and below Stairs, that they might search them. They found Money and Bills to the Amount of 105l. and several Articles of Plate. The Men, Two of whom were dressed in Blue Jackets and Caps, resembling those of Artillery Waggon Drivers, and the others in Red Jackets, resembling those of Foot Soldiers, continued in the House an Hour and an Half, and were all armed with Horse Pistols. The following is the Description of the Plate stolen, viz. A large Silver Tankard marked R M B on the Handle, at the Bottom of it Robert Baldwin, Broadfield; a Silver Cup, marked R B; a Silver Waiter with Three Legs, Eleven Silver Table Spoons, one large Gravy Spoon, a Pair of Saltcellars B; Five Table Spoons, Two marked R M B; One Pepper-Box and Marrow Spoon.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Burglary, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

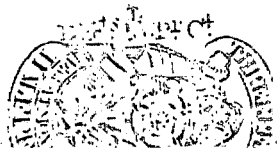
