By the Commissioners for managing and causing to be levied and collected His Majesty's Customs.

THE Commissioners, agreeably to the Directions which have been received from the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby give Notice to all Merchants, Traders, Brokers, Agents, and others whom it may concern, that, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, no Fee, Perquisite, Gratuity, or Reward, whether pecuniary, or of any other Sort or Description whatever, can legally be required, taken, or received by any Officer, Clerk, or other Person executing or performing, or assisting in the Execution or Performance of any of the Duties, or acting in any of the Offices or Employments in, or belonging to, His Majesty's Customs in the Port of London, enumerated or described in the following Table marked (A), for any Service, Act, Duty, Matter, or Thing done or performed, or to be done or performed, by any or either of such Officer, Officers, Clerk, or Clerks, or other Person or Persons, on account of, or relating to, any such Office or Employment; and if any such Officer, Clerk, or other Person shall, at any Time after the 10th Day of October 1806, require, take, or receive any Fee, Perquisite, Gratuity, or Reward, whether pecuniary, or of any other Sort or Description whatever, either directly or indirectly, on account of, or relating to, any such Office or Employment, or for any Service, Act, Duty, Matter, or Thing done or performed, or to be done or performed therein, although the same shall be freely offered or given, every such Officer, Clerk, or other Person so offending will, on Proof thereof, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, or any Four or more of them, be, for the first Offence, peremptorily dismissed from his Office or Employment, in pursuance of the Directions of the said Act, and be rendered incapable of ever again holding or executing, or act-
